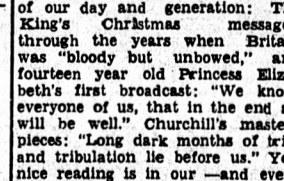

WALNUT BUTTERMILK LOAF
Mix and sift twice, then sift into a bowl, 2-1/2 c. once-sifted pastry flour (or 2-1/4 c. once-sifted hard-wheat flour), 2 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. baking soda, 1 1/2 tps. salt, 1/4 tsp. ground mace. Mix in 3/4 c. lightly-packed brown sugar, 3/4 c. rolled oats and 1 c. broken walnuts. Combine 1 well-beaten egg, 1 c. buttermilk, 2 tps. grated orange rind, 1 tsp. vanilla and 5 tps. the shortening, melted. Make a well in dry ingredients and add liquids; mix lightly. Turn into a loaf pan (4 1/2" x 8 1/2") which has been greased and lined with good paper. Bake in a rather slow oven, 225°, about 1 hour. Serve cold, thinly sliced and lightly buttered.
