In July, the Canadian Legion Branches in Prince County established a fine record of attendance at the Blood Donor Clinics which they sponsored at Tignish, Alberton and Summerside. Commanders in the Kensington and Mt. Stewart and Eldon Branches and the several Legion Branches in Kings County are determined to keep up with or exceed the fine showing made in Prince County earlier this summer.

The other clinic is to be held at Afton Hall, New Dominion, under the leadership of the Women's Institutes in that area.
