THE INCUBATOR. The Cause of Many Failures in First Attempts. A writer in the Australian Agriculturalist finds these causes of failure with many in their first efforts with the incubator: 1. Want of care in attention to cleanliness of lamp, causing flies to choke with soot, or burner to be covered with oil, causing all the top of lamp to be clothed in flame.
