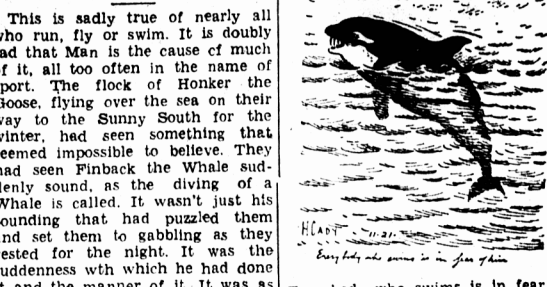

Contract Bridge

A BIDDING TRAP
As the cards lay in today's deal, South could have contracted for a slam, but he made the same number of points a great deal more safely!

East dealer
North-South vulnerable.

This was the very remarkable bidding:

East	South	West	North
1♠	1♥	4♠	Pass
5♦	5♥	Pass	Pass
Double	Pass	Pass	Pass

It goes without saying that East's double of five hearts was highly speculative, but the fact remains that it was South's extremely "fancy" one-heart overall which led to this result. Actually, South's choice of overalls was not nearly so shocking as may appear! South felt that because of his own void in diamonds, it was most improbable that the bidding would stop abruptly at one heart, and in this he was obviously correct! When, over East's five diamonds, South made the apparently suicidal overall of five hearts, East could not be blamed a great deal for feeling his opponent had gone slightly mad—to have bid only one on the first round and then to be "pushed" to the five-level!

West, feeling that he had shown his weakness by preempting, accepted the double, and now the fat was in the fire for East-West!

Declarer ruffed the opening diamond lead, led a heart to queen, and took the spade finesse. When the spade queen held, he cashed the spade ace, then went back to dummy's seven of hearts and ruffed a spade. He ran a few more rounds of trumps. But then, on the sound assumption that East had the club king as part of his double and that the finesse was hopeless, South led directly to the club ace. The fall of East's king was simply an extra "dividend" for declarer, who then ruffed another spade, setting up the fifth card of that suit. Another club to the queen put dummy in for the fourth time, and South's last club was discarded on the good spade, giving North-South all 13 tricks!
