Change In Pension Program May Delay Medical Care Plan

 OTTAWA (CP)—One result of the drastic change in the federal government's contributory old age pension program may be to delay action for some time on medical care insurance. Quebec's decision to go it alone on contributory, portable pensions means that the federal government must now find an extra \$116,000,000 a year to finance a \$10-a-month increase in the universal old age pension available to all at age 70. Administration sources say this unexpected new demand on already strained federal revenues, leaves that much less money available for new health or welfare measures.
 For a number of years the federal government has been making preparations for the next big step — health insurance. The royal commission on health services is preparing to report on a cross-Canada inquiry into health services.
 Informants say that if the commission recommends a health insurance program which involves great cost to the federal government chances of implementation are slim; indeed especially in the face of the additional heavy cost of raising the universal old age pension to \$75 a month. Originally it was intended to

increase the pension from money contributed by employers and employees under a portable Canada pensions plan. Money for the universal pension now is raised by taxes of three per cent on personal income, three per cent on corporation profits and three per cent on sales tax.
 One or more of these taxes now will have to be raised since Quebec employer - employee contributions to a portable pension plan will be held by the Quebec government and won't be available to Ottawa.
 Mr. Pearson, in indicating that loss of the Quebec contributions faces Ottawa with raising revenues for the \$10-a-month boost, put it this way: "It would be unfair to the people of other provinces to finance the additional payment to all older Canadians out of reduced contributions."
 Thus besides complicating the contributory, portable pensions picture, Quebec's decision to run its own portable plan has put a brake on any national health insurance program.
 "It recreates problems for the government on the political front since medical care insurance has been a prominent issue in the last three election campaigns.
 It provides an opportunity for opposition parties, who don't have to worry too much about where the money is coming from, to blame the Liberal government for dragging its feet on medical care insurance."

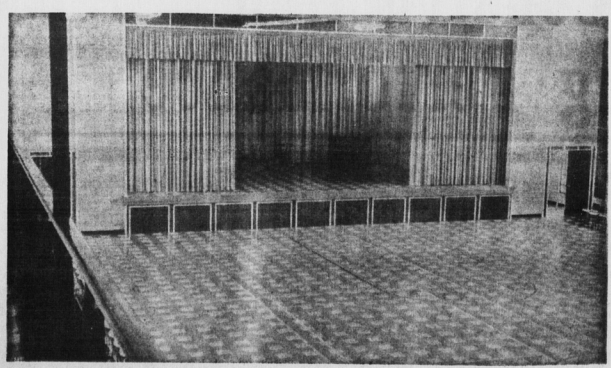

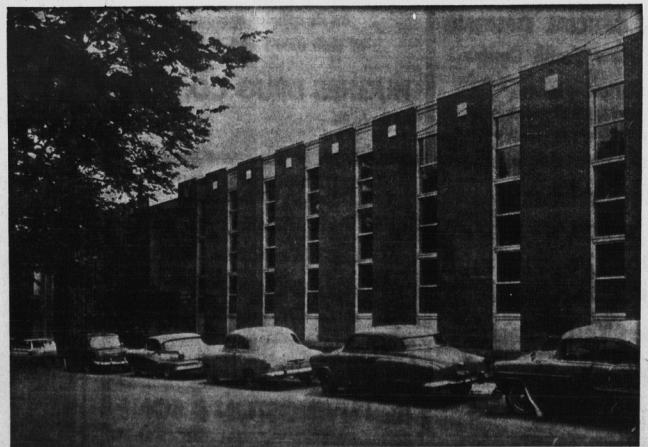
