Shah Is Engaged To Iranian Beauty

TEHRAN, Iran (AP)—Shah Mohammed Reza Pahlavi Monday proclaimed his engagement to Farah Diba, an Iranian beauty who hopes to bear him a son and heir to Iran's throne.

She had returned Saturday from buying her trousseau in Paris where she once studied at the Ecole des Beaux Arts.

The Shah gave Farah a ring with a diamond more than half an inch square that "shone like the sun," by account of a guest at the engagement ceremony.

EXCHANGE RINGS The Shah brought the diamond ring from his pocket and slipped it on Farah's finger. Farah gave the Shah a ring in return.

As the Shah's third wife, Miss Diba will become Queen Farah when they are wed Dec. 2 in a Moslem ceremony. He is 40, she 21. He divorced his first two wives because they did not bear him a son, and only sons can inherit Iran's throne.

The Shah, who tearfully divorced beautiful Princess Soraya in April, 1958, laughed and joked at the engagement ceremony in his private palace. Farah was all smiles.

Underground Blasts Probed

GENEVA (Reuters)—American, Soviet and British scientists are expected to open talks here in the near future on methods of detecting underground nuclear explosions, it was learned Monday.

Disagreement among the three nuclear powers on the detection of underground blasts has stalled progress on a three-way agreement which would outlaw nuclear tests under an elaborate control system.

The agenda the scientists will follow has not yet been settled by the three governments but informants say all three delegations are confident agreement will be reached in the next few days.

Future Of Fearful British Crew Is Seen Uncertain At Halifax

HALIFAX (CP)—The future of 21 British seamen who refused to stay aboard the vessel Westriver for a transatlantic crossing under a H. P. Wade, immigration officer here, said he hopes it will not be necessary to institute deportation proceedings and that "voluntary repatriation" of the men to England can be negotiated by the seamen and the company.

Meanwhile, there was no report on the whereabouts of the 10,000-ton bulk cargo carrier Westriver on the ocean-going Dutch tug Gela Zee, which is towing the big Bihh vessel to South Shields, England, for repairs. Lack of contact with either RCAF search and rescue or marine radio here indicated the vessels were having no trouble. The Westriver is manned by 16 men, most of them officers.

Disc Jockeys Are Quitting

NEW YORK (AP)—A wave of resignations hit the spinning world of disc jockeys Monday as radio and television stations pressed their own investigations into payments for record-plugging.

In New York, WNEW-TV dropped Alan Freed. In Detroit, Don McLeod resigned from WJBK—the third performer to leave that station in 36 hours. In Philadelphia, Joe Niagara resigned from his job at WBGZ radio.

Networks and some individual stations, taking a cue from congressional investigations, have started investigations of the payments by record companies or other sources to disc jockeys for plugging certain records.

Freed, who specializes in rock 'n' roll, repeated his denials that he ever accepted payments for broadcasting records. Station WNEW and the performer said after a conference that his contract was being terminated "by mutual agreement."

Freed said he has had several job offers but has not made definite plans for the future.

On a related subject, the president of the Mutual Broadcasting System said Monday rigged audience ratings of local broadcasting stations have been used to sell air time to advertisers.

Robert F. Harleigh, the president of the all-radio network, said in Chicago most local program ratings are based on "such small samplings as to be ridiculous." He added that "too often these ratings, at the local level, are pre-planned to aid the subscriber."

A Caramel Custard Dessert Is Elegant And Inexpensive

By IDA BAILEY ALLEN. Early in this century cut glass was the acme of elegance. One of the reasons it went out of fashion and into storage on top cupboard shelves was probably because so many cut glass dishes were used together in a table setting, that the glass lost its glamor.

CUT GLASS VASE Today, here in New York City, I passed a secondhand shop where, against a black velvet drop stood a gleaming cut glass vase, elegant with this star billing.

Coffee Tea Milk Chicken California: Brush 1 corn flaked 3 lb. broiler-fryer with corn oil. Dust with mixture of 3 tsp. flour, 1/2 tsp. salt, 1/2 tsp. powdered tarragon, 1/4 tsp. pepper and 1 tsp. instant onion.

If cut glass punch cups are hidden in your home, get them out. Fill them with that turn-of-the-century treat "Caramel Custard Float," and pass angel cake slices.

Arrange in large low casserole that can go to table. Tuck in 1/4 lb. sliced fresh mushrooms. Almost cover with 2 c. skim milk and 1 c. hot water containing 1 tsp. chicken bouillon powder. Cover with foil. Bake 45 min. in mod. oven, 350 degrees F. Remove foil. Brown on top.

Measurements are level: Caramel Custard Float: In a double boiler top scald 3 c. milk. Meantime caramelize or melt 1/2 c. sugar in frying-pan, stirring constantly until it becomes a light brown syrup.

Then, dividing service into sections, fill two opposite sections with overlapping pieces of tomato; dust with fresh ground black pepper.

In qt. bowl, slightly beat 3 whole eggs (or 6 egg yolks) with 1/4 tsp. salt. Pour in hot milk mixture. Return to double boiler. Cook-stir until it coats spoon. Half cool.

In two remaining sections arrange respectively thin-sliced celery or raw onion and shredded green peppers; and thin slices of cucumber with coarse-grated raw carrot.

Add 1/2 tsp. vanilla; chill. Serve very cold in glass punch cups or dessert dishes, topping each with a rosette of whipped cream and dusting with toasted chopped nut meats.

India Defence Stirs Critics

NEW DELHI (Reuters)—Prime Minister Nehru Monday promised his Congress Party a full discussion of V. K. Krishna Menon's handling of the nation's defence. Members of the party's parliamentary group at a stormy meeting urged Nehru himself to take over as defence minister from Menon, reliable sources said.
