dummy and Siniscalco was obliged to play his singleton ace. Siniscalco now went into a long huddle to decide what to return. He came out of it by returning a diamond which Forquet trumped. Back came the jack of spades, covered with the king, and Siniscalco ruffed with his only trump. Another diamond lead was trumped by Forquet who later also made his case of trump of defeat the contract two tricks—200 points.

The bidding:
West North East South
Forquet Pass Siniscalco Roth
2♣ Pass 4♠ 3♥

Opening lead—queen of spades.

One of the most sensational hands of the recent match for the world title between Italy and the United States was this one.

It had everyone buzzing. Forquet opened the bidding with a weak two bid, a purely preemptive effort. Siniscalco, in an effort to muddy the waters and create an illusion of strength, responded three clubs.

After Roth came in with three hearts and Forquet passed, Stone raised to four hearts which bought the contract.

Forquet opened the queen of spades and Roth properly decided spades could have the ace. The spade was therefore ducked in

The inspired defense by Siniscalco cost the American team 820 points—8 IMPs.

At the other table, after an extended series of gigs, the Italian pair who held the North-South cards also reached four hearts.

The same opening lead was made—the queen of spades. Again the spade was ducked in dummy, and again the lone ace won.

But the American East returned a club. Declarer took his ace and led a low heart toward the jack. West played low and the jack won the trick. Eventually, West made four trump tricks and South made four hearts—820 points.

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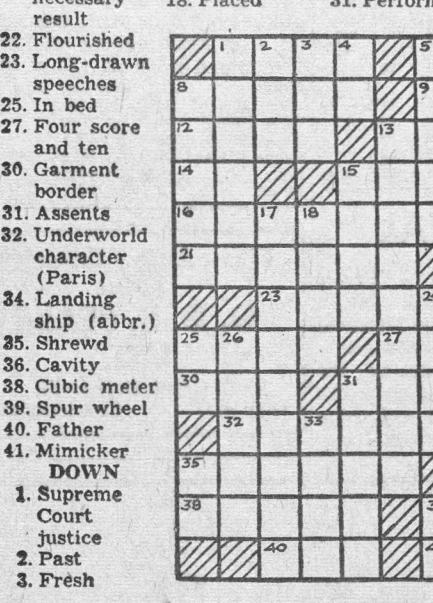

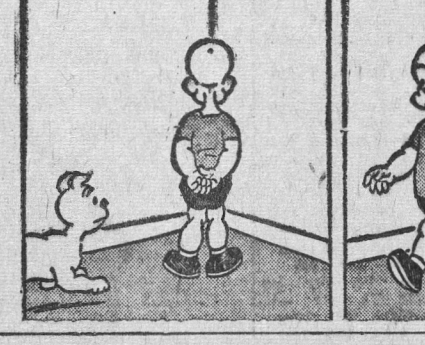


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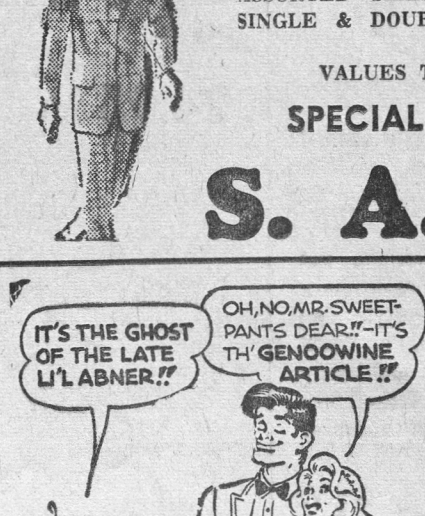

GRANDMAN, N.B.—(CP)

The body of Glendon Adams, 39, was found late Tuesday afternoon at Carrying Place Cove on the Maine coast. Search continued for a companion, Harley Brooks, 40, presumed dead when their outboard motor boat was discovered on the same beach. The men left White Head on Grand Manan Island Monday for a shopping trip to Eastport, Me. Their non-arrival in rough weather prompted a search by Fisheries Department patrol boats, fishing vessels, the United States Coast Guard and an RCAF search and rescue plane from Greenwood, N.S. A Coast Guard patrol from West Quoddy Light, Me., found the body and boat. Adams, a fisherman, was born in Yarmouth County, Nova Scotia. He is survived by his wife and young son. Brooks, unmarried, was proprietor of an ice cream store.
