

## New U. S. Foreign Aid Contains Advanced Weapons For Allies

 WASHINGTON (AP)—The Eisenhower administration urged Congress Monday to invest an additional \$4,900,000,000 in foreign aid as insurance against "augmented dangers to the free world."  
 "Military assistance is still needed and defence efforts cannot be relaxed in any degree," John Hollinger, director of the International Co-operation Administration, told the Senate foreign relations committee.  
 "Although today Soviet tactics are placing greater emphasis on economic overtures to the less developed nations, there is no indication that the danger of military aggression is over."  
**COMMUNIST BUILDUP**  
 "Communist military build-up in many parts of the world and communist distribution of modern weapons provide augmented dangers to the free world."  
 The administration is asking foreign aid funds for the fiscal year beginning July 1. Its new budget is \$2,200,000,000 more than Congress voted last year. Hollister, who runs the foreign aid program, said about \$3,000,000,000 worth of the new money would be used for military assistance.  
 Under questioning, the foreign aid chief said "there always is danger" of a renewal of fighting in Korea.

## Wins Scholarships From Germany

OTTAWA (CP)—A Halifax man has won one of two scholarships offered to Canada by West Germany, the external affairs department announced Wednesday.  
 The scholarship to be used in the 1956-57 academic year, goes to Alexander Farrell of Halifax.  
 Each scholarship is valued at \$900 and includes free tuition and transportation from the German border to the place of study in Germany and back to the border.  
 Mr. Farrell, a native of New Glasgow plans to take advanced study in German literature and eventually to teach that language.

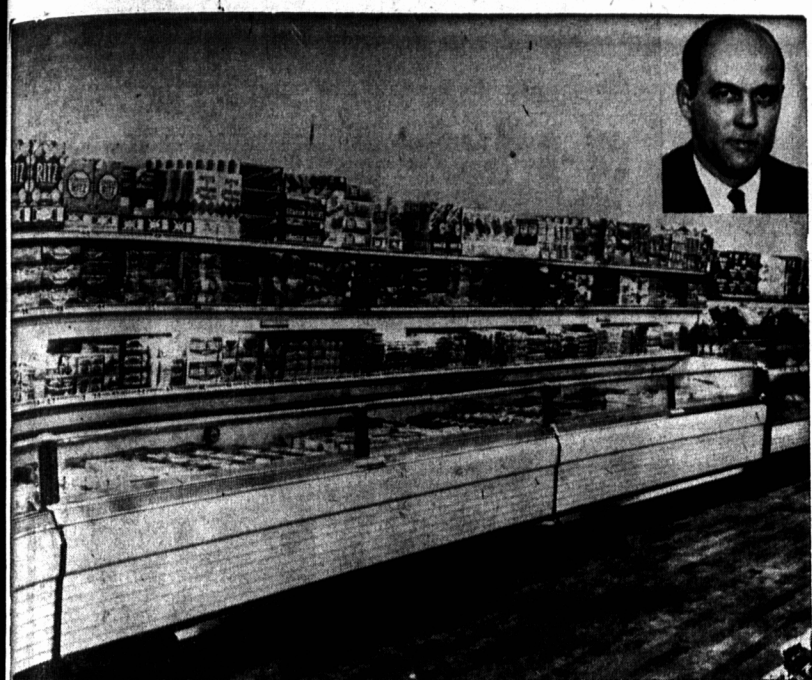

 A striking feature of the new store is the roominess which allows shoppers to make their selections in a selling area of about 5,000 square feet.  
 Refrigerated food and meat display cases line both sides of the store. Long, well stocked rows of grocery items occupy the main part of the selling area and at the back of the store is the modern meat counter.
