the dredging plant? Where is the spur line that should now be echoing with the rumbling wheels and shrieking whistle of the Mussel Mud train. Where these should now be seen and heard there is an ominous silence and a blank absence of every feature set before the farmers in the pretty picture painted in 1919. The waves of the Bay where the Mussel Mud lay roll on as they rolled before, still roll in the Bay and throw their spray as they break along the shore. The rest is silence. And not even a footprint in the sands remains to tell of that "forward step" which was to be taken by the Bell government to give the farmers cheap Mussel Mud from Richmond Bay!

True, something has been done for the farmers in the matter of Mussel Mud under the beneficent say of the author of the manifesto and our Farmer Commissioner Lea. Something had to be done in the face of that manifesto and the fact that we have now a real farmer as head of the Agricultural Department. Something was done. The dredging plant at Midgeil is closed down, and the spur line and wharf thereto are as silent and void of traffic as the mythical spur line to Richmond Bay. This appears to be so far the one step taken by the Bell Government to implement the lavish promises and professions made to the farmers in regard to enriching their fields. We ask our farmer friends Liberal and Conservative: Do you think this was a forward step? Are you quite satisfied with what has been done?

To be fair we must admit that something more has been done for the farmers and other electors throughout the province than 12 above set down. Our apparently just expectations of Mussel Mud from Richmond Bay have been disappointed. So also have been our expectations that the supply then existing would not be cut off as they have been. But we all have received something else instead, something that was not promised, or even hinted at in the manifesto or in the Liberal campaign speeches. We have got something that does not enrich the farmers' fields or line his pockets with wealth; something that has brought no joy to the household in city or country, to the rich or to the poor, to the laborer, the artisan, the fisherman or the farmer. We refer to the poll tax and other doubled taxes. Many have been disappointed in this. To be promised enrichment for his fields and not to get it, but to get instead a bitter up on his head, and upon his son's heads really did disappoint many good farmers. Just what they intend to do about it we shall learn when the next election comes!
