Harry Poulton Wins Unanimous Decision; Hays Defeats Wouters

HALIFAX, June 27 — (CP)—Norman Hays, a 19-year-old bolo puncher from Boston, won a majority decision over Roy Wouters, Canadian middleweight champion, in a 10-round non-title bout here tonight. The decision was boobyed by the fans, who apparently thought Wouters had shown enough in the early rounds, despite a fast finish by Hays, to take the fight. Weights were Hays 157 1-2, Wouters 156 1-2.

Wouters, fighting from a crouch and scoring repeatedly with an overhand right to the head, was the aggressor most of the night, in the early rounds, when he opened a cut over Hays' eye. He chased the Boston boy all over the ring, belaboring him with solid left hooks to the body, and infight accurately.

Harry Poulton, Charlottetown, 145 1-2, gave Tommy (Gun) Spencer, New Waterford, 149, a boxing lesson in winning a unanimous decision in the eight-round semi-final. The "Gun" was gun-shy and rusty after a layoff of 17 months. The Nova Scotian was in superb condition but was baffled by the unorthodox but extremely effective tactics of the Maritime welterweight champion. Poulton delighted fans with his fancy antics, particularly a loop-the-loop right hand swing. Mixed in with his ring buffoonery howl, was a sound sense of timing that enabled him to hit Spencer almost at will with a left jab, and a sharp right cross. The crowd was pro-Spencer but the "Gun" just didn't have the ammunition.
