FOOLED THE PREMIER.

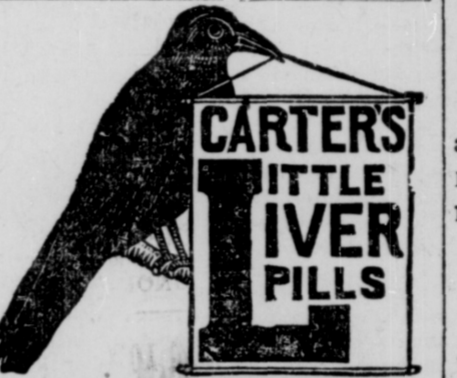

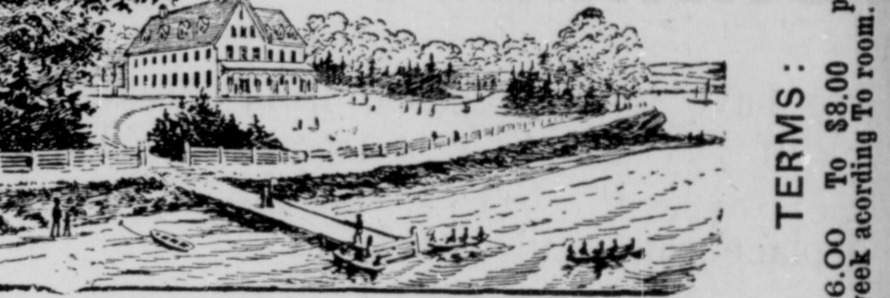
