It is a little girl, 14 months old, with two heads and shoulders, and four arms, but only two feet. It was born in St. Benoit, near Montreal, of French parents, both of whom are with it. Conversing with Doctors Moren and Wickwire who had seen it recently, our reporter learned that it is all that it is represented to be, is certainly one of the greatest wonders of the age, and well worth seeing.—Hc. The Governor of New York thinks, with Lord Dufferin, that measures should be taken conjointly with the Governments of the State of New York and of the Province of Ontario to put an end to what may be called the desecration of the famous Falls of Niagara, by the expulsion from its surroundings of the herds of hucksters and sharpers that throng around it to the annoyance of visitors.
