Move To Amend B.N.A. Act Strongly Assailed In Commons

Government Resolution Denounced By Every Opposition Group. Provinces' Abuse Of Powers Seen.

OTTAWA, May 16—Every Opposition group in the House fell violently upon the resolution to amend the British North America Act in the House of Commons Thursday.

It is the unanimous wish of the provinces that this power should be granted to them. They have accepted it, although they wanted more. The drafting of the amendment was their work as well as that of the law officers of this Government and this amendment meets their views.

Explaining the exact effect of the taxation features, the Minister pointed out that the taxing power given the provinces extended only to retail sales taxes. This power was withheld in the case of certain commodities brought in under high customs or excise duties, as it was felt that it was undesirable that the provinces should invade this field.

Hon. C. H. Cahan (Cons., St. Lawrence-St. George), forming the spearhead of the Conservative attack, declared that inter-provincial trade would be stifled by the proposed taxation powers.

Right Hon. E. B. Bennett said that the Dominion was giving away a valuable source of taxation. He was also bitter in his denunciation of retroactive clauses, validating indirect taxes already levied by the provinces.

Hon. Ernest Lapointe (Minister of Justice), who sponsored the resolution, declared that there was no other alternative except to create subsidies to the provinces.

Mr. Cahan immediately raised the point that the consent of all the provinces should be obtained before proceeding with the resolution. In this case, he characterized the resolution as "premature."

Under the field of provincial taxation dealt with in the resolution, the Minister said that it would remove doubt as to the validity of taxes already levied by the provinces. It would, in fact, widen to some extent the provincial taxation field.

Reviewing the question of Dominion and provincial taxes, he recalled that Confederation provided that the provinces were to have Dominion subsidies to make up to them the loss of customs and excise revenues.

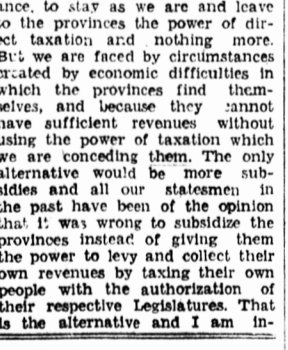

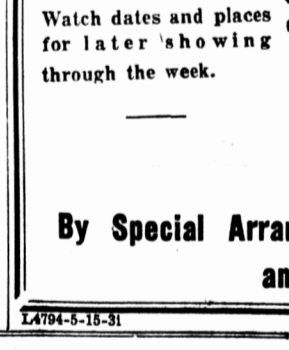
