Malnutrition ended life

NEW YORK (AP) — Neighbors at the Bronx apartment building on East 163rd St. had gotten used to seeing William Dellibovi, 67, take his wife out for a breath of air in her wheelchair.

Mrs. Dellibovi, 68, was almost completely helpless, paralyzed by multiple sclerosis. Her husband used to carry her down two flights of stairs to the wheelchair.

Last week, however, no one saw the Dellibovis. A neighbor called police Sunday.

Officers who broke into the apartment found Dellibovi dead in one room of a heart attack. He had been dead several days. The body of his wife was found in the next room, lying on a bed. Police estimated it may have taken as long as four days for death to come to her as she lay helpless. She died, a medical examiner said, apparently of malnutrition.

Double-breasted look is feature

NEW YORK (CP) — Fall coats continue the slim look that came in last spring. But more shaping is indicated. They can no longer really be called skinny. High armholes and set-in sleeves give a narrowing look to shoulders.

The widened shoulder that has been introduced for several seasons as a trial balloon hasn't yet quite caught on. But a few fashion firms still have faith in the extra little breadth to shoulders. However, the majority of fall coats achieve balance from slim shoulders and move in slightly to the body.

The most popular single feature is the double-breasted look. Some designers are intrigued by a muffled-up top and make the neckline the fashion point. Monte-Sano and Pruzan call them "snuggler necklines" and cut the coat collars almost like high-standing cuffs. They button up practically under the nose. Obviously they can be turned down at will as not everyone wants to be muffled up all the time. Other coats have fringed scarves to snugle high around the throat.

PRESENT SLIM LOOK

In the fall collections presented by the New York couture group, two weathervanes are Davidow and Originala. Davidow can be counted on for the latest conservative viewpoint. This fall, Davidow's look is more naturally shaped, softer and complemented by detailing. Originala is the trend-maker. While the slim, slightly shaped look prevails here, too, there was emphasis on the regency and guardsman silhouettes. The regency skirt has fullness in deep side pleats in front and a double pleated panel in the back under a half-belt. The guardsman silhouette is derived from the slim-waisted Coldstream Guard's overcoat. It has a more restrained skirt flare than the regency.

Arthur Jablow's version combined a seamed waistline with a tapering skirt, vented in the back. This waisted and flared skirt is the silhouette that will probably take over in the spring. It's something to keep

In mind for your fall buying, as a fashion hold-over.

Originala also introduced several raglan sleeves. One such raglan-sleeved coat was in black-and-brown shadow plaid, worn over a ripple-weave suit. This is another fall feature. Coats are designed to go with a suit. Mostly, as the coat mentioned above, they are not match-mates. One interesting combination was a green-and-brown Linton tweed coat over a muted small checked suit.

WRAPPED COAT BACK

There's a renewed interest in camel color this fall. A number of the raglan-sleeved camel coats reverse to plaids or checks. Oddly, bright Bristol blue is strong as a coat color. Originala even used it in a poplin raincoat for late-day wear, sporting jewel buttons.

Other popular fall colors for coats include grey (important coats to evening gowns), oyster or a new alabaster in the creamy neutrals, pure yellow, and raspberry red.

The wrapped coat that made a tentative bid last spring for popularity appears in major collections but not as a major trend. Often the coat is part of an ensemble, as a walnut brown coat over a tangerine-and-blue paisley print dress.

A number of the wrap coats are fur-lined, usually the casual look of tweed with expensive fur. Even corduroy takes on a mink lining. Some of the slim coats are fur-lined too. Here the short-haired furs are used. Monte-Sano and Pruzan combined a pink wool coat with mauve moleskin.

In the Canadian collection, presented in Montreal before New York showings, fur trim was almost a must on all coats. Some were collared and cuffed in fur. Others were fur-lined.

This emphasis on fur trim was not a feature in the New York collections. Certainly fur was used but mostly with the increasingly important theatre and evening coats, or on late-day dresses themselves. Few of the street coats were fur-trimmed.



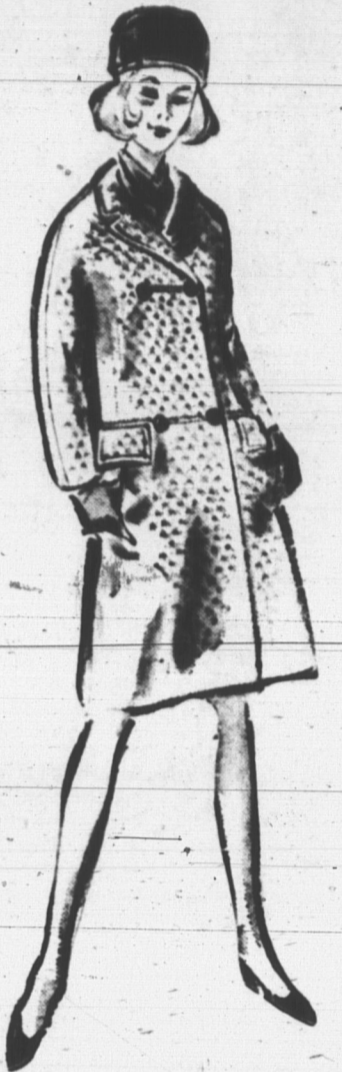

Mission follows predictable lines

UNITED NATIONS (Reuters) — U Thant's peace-seeking mission to Pakistan and India has followed predictable lines, according to UN diplomats. But there was no disposition here Sunday to write off his efforts as a failure.

The most that had been hoped for from the secretary-general's first round of talks in Rawalpindi and New Delhi was an end of the fighting and this was still thought at UN headquarters in New York to be a possibility.

Diplomatic sources said the crucial stage in the negotiations would come during his second visit to Rawalpindi, after conferences in New Delhi with the Indian leaders.

Though U Thant had planned as the outset to leave the

continent today to return to New York, he now is expected to remain there until later in the week.

Some informants said they did not rule out a return trip after he reports back to the Security Council, which authorized his intervention.

The report is expected to be confidential, though there may also be a supplementary public statement.

Relatively little attention is being paid in diplomatic quarters here to what press reports referred to as "peace terms" by both sides. These "terms" differ little from the mutually incompatible positions of the two sides with which council members are familiar from long enunciation during the protracted Kashmir dispute.
