For travelling the bride wore a pale green linen suit with white accessories and matching corsage. Mr. and Mrs. Ellis will reside in Summerside. — S.

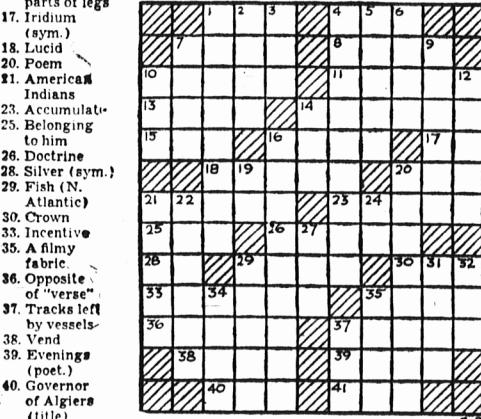

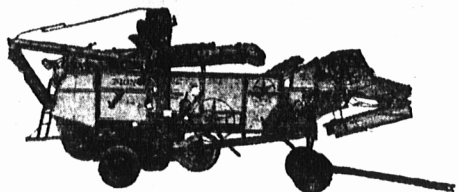
MOBILE STATIONS
