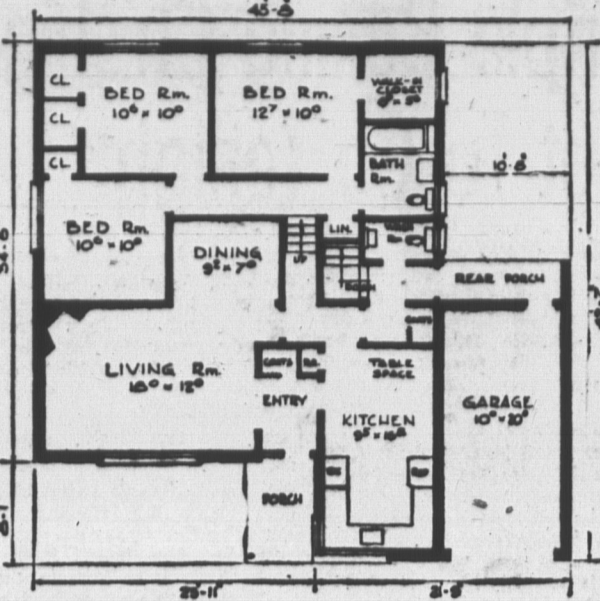
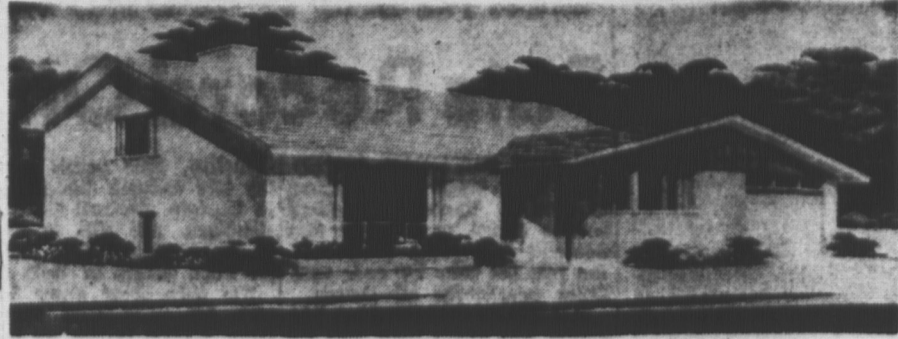

First Aid For Ailing Houses

QUESTION: Before we could finish the walls in our newly paneled recreation room, the area behind the couch became stained by hair oil, where people leaned back against it. How can we remove these stains before varnishing?

ANSWER: Make a thick paste of powdered whiting or other absorbent powder and a non-flammable liquid spot remover, and cover the greasy area with a thick layer of the paste.

QUESTION: We tried to change the color of our cement patio by painting it with a good brand of paint. This peeled off. Then we put on a sealer and repainted. Again, it peeled. Now we have a very rough surface. What is the best way to do whatever is necessary to make the next paint job last. What do you suggest?

ANSWER: Although you state you used a good brand of paint, did you use a rubber base floor and deck type, designed for use on concrete? The finish of your patio (I assume you were careful about removing all trace of the old paint) may be too smooth. You mention a sealer, but not etching the cement surface. Use either a prepared etching and cleaning preparation for masonry surfaces, or etch the concrete with a dilute hydrochloric (muriatic) acid, followed by thorough rinsing.

Fisheries Sees Outlook Good HALIFAX (CP)—Ocean Fisheries Ltd. one of Canada's biggest seafood producers, says its business outlook for next year is good.

In a letter to shareholders with a 6 1/2-cent quarterly dividend, the company says fish markets are strong and so is the demand for its products.

First-year operations of its new \$8,000,000 processing plant at Lunenburg, N.S., are described as "quite satisfactory."

Early this year Ocean Fisheries also took over the plants of three lobster companies in the Maritimes — Maritime Packers, E. Paturel Ltd., and Conley's Lobsters.

The letter says final audit figures are not yet available but 1965 operating results are expected to be better than last year. In 1964 the company reported a net profit of 1.6 per cent on net sales of \$32,900,000.

Dickey Dam Project Is Back In Water Projects Package

WASHINGTON (CP) — The Dickey dam on the Upper St. John River in Maine has been reintroduced in a package of water projects before Congress.

The House of Representatives, in a move led by hostile private-power and coal interests, had voted recently to delay the \$227,000,000 project, after the Senate had given its approval.

The Dickey project will have to face strong House opposition again, although its supporters, led by Senator Edmund Muskie of Maine, have expressed cautious optimism that this time they have the votes.
