On Tuesday morning the students of Summerside High School assembled in the auditorium where they listened to Dr. Hitchmanova, secretary of the Unitarian Service Committee of Canada. Dr. Hitchmanova has just returned from her 4th world survey of fourteen different countries in Europe and Asia.

Now she is travelling on a Trans-Canada fund raising tour to gather money and clothing for the very unfortunate children of school age whom she encountered on her tour. She spoke particularly of the children of Korea where the children learn in warehouses, tents and church hall from a teacher who has copied his own lesson-book by hand.

Pilot projects give scholarships to the most intelligent and promising. Money from Prince Edward Island will go towards a Maritime pilot project at a vocational school to be provided for in school where crafts will be taught.

Dr. Hitchmanova said there is a need for warm clothing in Greece, India and the Middle East as well as Korea where 13,900 people are still cave dwellers since the last war.

"THE COUNTERFEIT PLAN" AT CAPITAL

The inside story of the world's biggest counterfeit ring is revealed today at the Capital Theatre Summerside in "The Counterfeit Plan" starring Zachary Scott and Peggie Castle.

The Warner Bros. release of the Amalgamated production tells the story of five men and a woman who plan to shake down two continents for one hundred dollars.

Scott, as the leader of the gang, is not unfamiliar in the role of a villain on the screen. His first film, "The Mask of Dimitrios," established his rugged looks as good "bad man" material. Subsequently he has played menacing roles in such notable successes as "Mildred Pierce," "Ruthless" and "Unfaithful."

The tall, green-eyed blonde Miss Castle was first seen in 1930, when she debuted for Elliott Nugent in "Bebevedere Goes to College" and since then she has been seen in such films as "The Jury," "Tall Man Riding," "Target Zero," and "Miracle in the Rain," as well as having many appearances on television to her credit. In "The Counterfeit Plan," she is cast as

a young artist who becomes implicated with the counterfeiters in order to rescue her father from the gang's clutches. Seen in supporting roles are Mervyn Johns, Sydney Tafler, and Lee Patterson. "The Counterfeit Plan" was directed by Montgomery Tully from a screen play by James Eastwood.
