It is with a great deal of embarrassment that I write you this letter of apology and explanation for an article which was published in the Jan. 15 edition of the Cadre concerning the suggested 11% wage increase for the U.P.E.I. faculty.

At the time, I believed that I was right in the saying that this was a "demand" of the faculty and that you were the cause of it.

However, after hearing your explanation of the situation on "Island Gazette", I realized that it was I who was wrong and that my accusations were premature. I now understand that you are the Faculty Association's spokesman and not a parallel with the leader of a Union, and that your "demand", as I put it was merely a suggested working figure for a basis of discussion with the administration.

I would like to further point out that I did attempt to interview you but each time I went to your office, you were not in. Also since all articles had to be completed by Tuesday afternoon in order to be sent to the publishers on time, I was forced/or so I thought to write the article myself

But there is one point which needs clarification. This concerns the front page of the Cadre in which it appears that the faculty of U.P.E.I. is being depicted as a monster. This was certainly not the intention of the editorial board.
