

**"HONG KONG" COLORFUL CELLULOID ADVENTURE, PACKS REAL WALLOP**

In "Hong Kong," which opens today at the PRINCE EDWARD Theatre, producers William Pine and William Thomas have adhered to their effective formula of fast-moving action and colorful backgrounds. The result is a solidly exciting Technicolor film that deals tersely and imaginatively with a violent episode in the world's Number One trouble spot. Starring Ronald Reagan and Rhonda Fleming, this William Pine-William Thomas production uses present-day China as the framework for a forceful tale of a tallous soldier of fortune and a beautiful girl who come together in the Communist armies sweeping toward the sea. Desperately racing toward the sanctuary of Hong Kong, they chaperone a young

Chinese boy whose father has just been killed in an air attack. Reagan and Miss Fleming acquit themselves excellently, and four-year-old Danny Chang, playing the orphaned boy, delivers what probably rate as the surprise performance of the season. Lewis R. Foster's direction underlines the tension and suspense of the Winston Miller's screenplay, and the colorful Oriental backgrounds serve as a vivid framework for an absorbing drama.
