

N. A. Herald Tribune Congratulates Pearson

NEW YORK (CP) — Lester B. Pearson is congratulated by the New York Herald Tribune today for providing a "historic" victory for the Progressive Conservatives cannot win Canadians all the time by pressing a "hick" TV news.

The newspaper says the first insult was President Kennedy's appeal to the Canadian Parliament, "over Prime Minister Diefenbaker's head," to join the hemisphere "in an alliance for economic progress."

The idea was sound, says the editorial, but the time and the place were wrong.

The editorial also deals with the "fat-headed" state department press release concerning Canadian defence policies, followed by McNamara's comment that, if nothing else, Canada's two Bomarc bases would serve to draw Soviet rockets in the event of nuclear war.

The news editorial expresses delight "that so many Canadians are beginning to say anti-Americanism in this election. But like The Times, it concludes: "We can't help reflecting that if the state department had kept it's over-zeal vespit about Canadian defence, Mr. Pearson might well have won far more handsomely than he did."

Opening lead—king of hearts. Here is an instructive hand. It shows a trick more to this game of bridge than to any other game he ever meets the eye.

First, let's see how the hand was actually played. West led the king of hearts and continued with the ace. Declarer refused, drew two rounds of trumps, and then played a club towards dummy. East took the queen and the ace and returned a club to the king. Declarer led the jack of diamonds and
