Getting Monkeys Was Hard Job

MONTREAL (CP) - William Jones, former Canadian government commercial secretary in India, remembers best of all the monkey business there.

Back in Canada after two years in India, Mr. Jones recalled the problems of getting the monkeys to Canada for use in the production of Salk anti-polio vaccine.

Export permits were cancelled in 1955, after 390 monkeys died en route to the United States, and he had to persuade the Indian government to continue to allow them to be sent to Canada. The animals - rhesus monkeys, weighing from five to 10 pounds - are regarded by some Hindu sects as sacred.

"The practical advantages of exporting them outweigh the religious antipathy to doing so," he said.

In August, Mr. Jones will become commercial secretary for Canada in Washington.

Is Officially Anti-Witchcraft

HANNOVER, Germany (AP) - Hundreds of Germans still believe in witchcraft. Hobbes of superstition lie in remote areas of Lower Saxony State.

Dr. Rolf Dummernann, chief of the state health department, says "You just cannot stamp it out entirely." He is in charge of an official anti-witchcraft campaign.

Only recently, Dummernann's files show, a woman went on trial for claiming she could remove the witch from man and animals. Another woman successfully peddled a mixture of starved caterpillars and dried leaves to ward off the evil eye.

A man shot his mother-in-law, claiming she had bewitched his family and caused unhappiness. A 19-year-old youth shot his grandfather because he believed the old man had bewitched him.

A villager slashed a woman when 67 hogs died after she allegedly had put the evil eye on them.
