### Plan To Form Canadian Club

At a meeting of representative citizens held at the Charlottetown Hotel last night, plans were made for the formation of a Canadian Club which would draw its membership from throughout the Province.

The main speaker was Mr. Eric Morse, national director for Canadian Clubs of Canada.

Mr. Morse outlined the objects and purposes of Canadian Clubs which he said were for fostering throughout Canada an interest in public affairs and to cultivate an attachment to Canadian institutions. There are presently 100 Canadian Clubs in Canada with a membership of over 40,000.

Presiding over the meeting was Mr. Justice G. J. Tweedy. On a motion from the floor which was duly seconded, it was decided to ask the Dominion Association for a charter to come into effect in October. A provisional committee consisting of Dr. Frank MacKinnon, Mrs. Elsie Inman and Mr. A. Walthen Gaudet were named to organize the initial fall meeting at which time a representative of the national association would be present to deliver the address.

It is hoped that between six and eight meetings will be held annually with a special speaker from the parent association at each meeting.
