General Telegraphic News.

St. JOHN'S, Nfld, June 16.—There is more trouble on the French Shore. The lobster fishermen maliciously destroyed 350 lobster traps belonging to Mr. Baird's agent at Port-aux-Français, St. George's Bay, and carried off a large quantity of rope. The French allege that the British lobster fishery interferes with their cod fishery. The war steamers Emerald and Pelican have been sent to make an investigation. The case of Mr. Baird against Sir Baldwin Walker has been appealed to the English privy council. Mr. Baird, with Sir James Winter, his counsel, will sail for England soon, to argue his case before the privy council.

CINCINNATI, Ohio, June 16.—A bridge over Licking river, between Covington and Newport, fell to day, carrying down with it many men. Reports differ as to the number killed, at 30. The bridge was in course of construction and the cause of the fall is thought to be the weakening of the wooden false works. A force of 45 men were at work on the bridge to day engaged in putting in place the heavy iron work on the main span when suddenly there was a cracking sound of breaking timbers and a headlong plunge of the whole mass into the water 50 feet below. A few forms were to be seen struggling on the surface. Twenty were drowned or crushed by the material. Others two bodies have been taken from the river; thus far.
