## Something Is Wrong - Low Wages

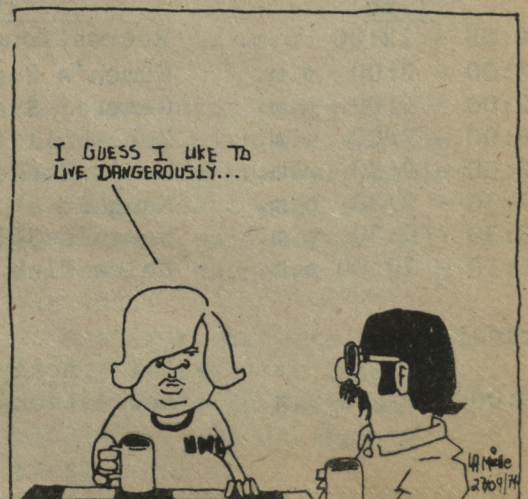
I feel concerned for the plight of the maintenance workers; I also do feel that they have justification in their strike. Who does not feel so - the administration? Let's look back to Art Laffin's article Oct 27 on double values. Now let's put this idea into effect. The administration says they have no way to increase the pay for the maintenance workers - it's not economically feasible, but let's keep in mind

that individually the administration feels that the workers deserve better wages but can't say so. More specifically, in the Student Union assembly of Oct. 28 President Baker said that the maintenance workers need more money but there isn't enough to go around. So it is difficult to raise wages because that would affect someone else. In effect, the money comes from grants, the student fees and loans and

then goes into a pot to be split up between maintenance, Faculty, and Administration.

Now let's look at the Maintenance workers who live on these salaries, especially those who are married. It would seem the bigger the family, the more the discomforts of a minimal income. As one worker told me 'What we are really worried about are those people who are married, who need money to support a family'. But the lack of income can cause disfunctions within a family. But the lack of income can cause great troubles in a household. If the husband needs to work at two or three jobs and his wife work just to support a family something is wrong. The question now is not only the hurting of the workers but of an entire family unit.

If the university pays minimal wages, they are downgrading society for those wages do no good but hurt society by denying the individual a chance to fulfill himself. Low wages may be economical but sacrificing a man's self-fulfillment and his family's security just doesn't help too much.
