Women Took Key Role In Polish Strike

LODZ, Poland (Reuters) — Polish women played a key role in the 48-hour strike by 40,000 municipal transport workers which ended Wednesday in a defeat for the strikers as the army moved in.

Authorities forced the strikers back to work and made no concession to them on their claim for higher pay on the ground that the country's economy cannot afford further wage increases.

Reports told how women conductors stood in the front row to oppose soldiers and police who advanced with fixed bayonets to occupy and take over the streetcar depot in Pabianice. At another depot, a woman tried to prevent streetcars from running by laying down on the track.

A communique said workers decided Tuesday to resume work, "considering the strike as being wrong and unjust."

Street cars early Wednesday morning were driven by inspectors with armed escorts. But as the morning wore on, more and more regular drivers took over and armed escorts were dropped.
