Vehicle Output Up For Canada

OTTAWA (CP)—Motor vehicle production in Canada increased 5.1 per cent in May to 70,692 units from 67,195 in the same month last year, the bureau of statistics said today.

With gains in all earlier months of the year, output for the January-May period advanced 21.5 per cent to 333,876 units from 274,141 a year previous.

Production of passenger cars increased to 59,356 units in May from 56,221 in May of last year and to 299,278 in the January-May period from 244,940. Output of commercial vehicles climbed to 11,336 in May from 10,674 a year previous and to 54,598 units in the five months from 46,201.

Cargo moved through Canadian canals in 1963 rose 17.3 per cent to 74,585,427 tons compared with 1962. Larger shipments of wheat and iron ore through the St. Lawrence canal accounted for most of the increase.

BUS OVERTURNS

GURNEE, Ill. (AP)—Three women were killed and 47 other persons were injured Tuesday when a chartered bus struck a bridge abutment and overturned on a rain-slick highway. Sheriff Charles E. Larson said a mechanical failure on the bus may have caused the accident on U.S. 41, about 40 miles north of Chicago, as the bus was en route to Milwaukee.

Presbyterians Defer Move On Doctrine Talks With UC

TORONTO (CP)—Consideration of a proposal that the Presbyterian Church in Canada hold consultations with the United Church of Canada on matters of doctrine was deferred by the general assembly Friday.

Reporting for the committee on articles of faith, Rev. Scarth Macdonnell of Montreal asked for such consultations to determine the need for informed and representative study of "the historical and theological basis for the continuance of denominations."

His committee asked for permission, through a sub-committee of the United Church, to confer with a similar committee of the Presbyterian Church.

However, the committee on inter-church relations announced it intends to recommend the 49 presbyteries of the church across Canada continue a study of Presbyterian position for a year.

The assembly Friday was to defer a decision on doctrinal consultations until the two committees—faith and order and inter-church relations—can confer, probably next week.

Governor-General To Give Keynote Conference Address

OTTAWA (CP)—Governor-General Vanier will deliver the keynote address at the opening ceremony of the Canadian conference on the Family Sunday afternoon at Government House.

The conference, sponsored by the Governor-General and Mme. Vanier, will continue to Wednesday at the Governor-General's residence.

The federal government has designated Sunday as "Family Day" in Canada in recognition of the conference opening, which will be attended by more than 1,500 official guests and conference delegates.

Prime Minister Pearson, Mr. Justice Samson, Freedman of the Manitoba Court of Appeal, Mr. Justice Gerald Fauteux of the Supreme Court of Canada and the conference president, A.D. P. Healey of Ottawa, will participate in the ceremony.

Sources at Government House said the conference opening will be the largest gathering of its type ever held at the Governor-General's residence.

The opening is scheduled to take place on the lawns outside Government House, but the event of poor weather it will be held in the ballroom.

If the ceremony has to be moved inside, arrangements for closed circuit television are being made so that guests unable to be seated in the ballroom

Professors Back Quebec In Constitution Demands

QUEBEC (CP)—Two professors in international law said Friday Quebec should have no scruples about proposing an entirely new Canadian constitution or demanding the right to conclude international agreements in fields recognized as being in its jurisdiction by the British North America Act.

Jacques-Yves Morin of the University of Montreal and Andre Parry of Laval University in Quebec City were questioned for 2½ hours at the first session of the legislature committee set up to define the objectives of French Canada and constitutional revisions needed to realize them.

Professor Morin said the committee should not feel itself imprisoned by the present constitution "corset" and should feel itself free to propose an entirely new Canadian constitution rather than attempt to "get

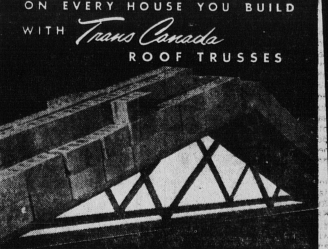

Macquarrie Queried On Leadership Rumor

OTTAWA — Any decision to seek the leadership of the Prince Edward Island Conservative Party would be premature, Heath Macquarrie, MP for Queens, said here Friday.

He was commenting on a recent United Press report of a possible pending shake-up of

political parties in the province, stemming from the likely retirement of Premier Walter Shaw and Opposition Leader A. W. Matheson.

"Premier Shaw is an excellent health and is a strong premier, so it would be an impropriety for me to make any comment on a possible successor at this time," Mr. Macquarrie said.

At the same time he made it clear that the possibility of returning to the Island to enter provincial politics has been given some considerable thought.

"Too much depends on the federal situation and there are so many uncertainties about what might happen between now and Premier Shaw's eventual retirement, that it is not possible to say anything with any degree of certainty now," Mr. Macquarrie said.

"Naturally, I feel very honored and delighted that some one has seen fit to mention my name in this connection."

The UPI story suggested that the Conservative caucus had discussed the matter and had decided on a caucus appointment which would tend to favor Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae.

BUILD NUCLEAR PLANTS

LAHORE (AP) — Pakistan plans to build its first two nuclear power plants with Canadian and American help. Dr. I. H. Umani, the chairman of the Pakistan Atomic Energy Commission, said Friday his government hopes to get a Canadian loan for a \$50,000,000 plant at Karachi. Both are expected to be operating by 1968.

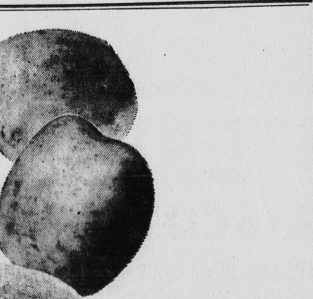
