

Big, Speeding Fireball Described As Meteor

NEW YORK (AP)—The chairman of the Hayden Planetarium said a fireball streaked across the eastern United States into Canada Monday night was an exceptionally bright meteor, probably 10,000 times brighter than the sky's brightest star.

and state police said they believed it to be a meteor. A spokesman at Andrews Air Force Base in Maryland said he believed it was a meteorite and that it had landed north of New York City.

However, in Albany, N.Y., John Calabrist, vice-chairman of the astronomical society of Broome County, said that, in his opinion, the object was a man-made satellite breaking up.

Dion Trial Date Likely For October

QUEBEC (CP)—The October criminal assizes term has been set as the time for the possible trial of Leopold Dion on capital murder charges.

Dion, 44, already is serving a life imprisonment sentence for the murder of Pierre Marquis, 13, whose body was discovered in 1963 about 30 miles from Quebec City.

The bodies of three other boys were found at about the same time. Dion has been charged with capital murder in connection with their deaths.

The fixing of a time for his trial on these charges does not necessarily mean that a trial will be held. This matter still is under study by the Quebec justice department.

Dion made a Monday appearance before Chief Justice Frederic Dorion of Quebec Superior Court, who set the time for the possible trial.

"Hang me right now and get the business over with once and for all," shouted Dion as he was led from the courtroom. He was originally sentenced to be hanged for the slaying of the Marquis youth, but the sentence was commuted in December to life imprisonment.

A justice department official said last week that it was "within the realm of possibility" that Dion would face a second trial.

Put Welfare Of Others First Historian Urges Canadians

OTTAWA (CP)—Montreal author and historian Murray Ballantyne has urged Canadians to put the welfare of others before their own welfare.

Mr. Ballantyne, 57, honorary secretary of the Vanier Institute of the Family, told representatives of 25 faith groups from all parts of Canada who are in Ottawa to attend the Canadian Inter-faith Conference.

The root difficulty with family life today is lack of a sense of community, of belonging, of cohering.

Much of what used to be done in the family now is being done inadequately outside. Care of the elderly used to be a family function.

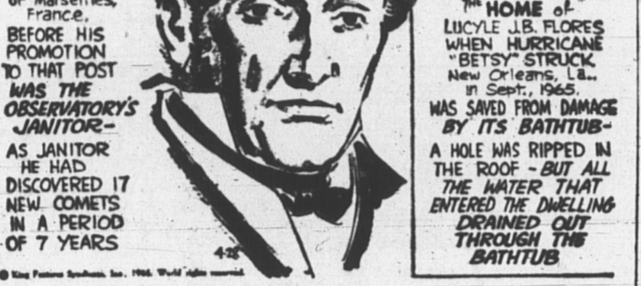
Mr. Ballantyne, a member of the board of directors of the inter-faith conference, said Canada needs more and better clubs, unions and associations of all kinds co-operative series and co-operative old people's homes, parent-teacher associations and active school boards.

The conference, established in July, 1965, through a centennial commission grant, is made up of representatives of 31 religious faiths. It is planning nationwide religious observances for the 1967 centennial, particularly on three key holidays, New Year's Day, July 1 and Thanksgiving Day.

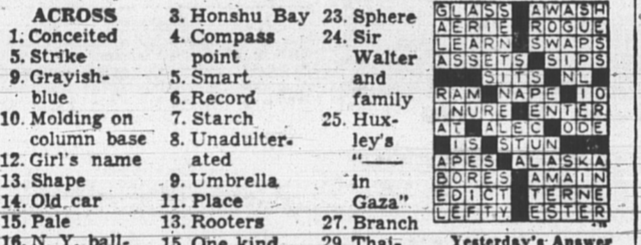
The conference also discussed plans for a book of inter-faith prayers and hymns and a proclamation to be read in churches, mosques, synagogues and cathedrals during 1967.
