

Payments Deficit Dips During '63

OTTAWA (CP) — Canada's international payments deficit, while still huge, dipped again in the first quarter of 1963 to continue the improvement begun last year.

An export surplus and a smaller tourist deficit combined to reduce the overall current account deficit to \$243,000,000 in the January-March period, the bureau of statistics said here.

This is a drop of \$90,000,000 from a \$333,000,000 deficit in the first quarter of 1962. In the same period of 1961 the deficit was \$377,000,000.

New U.S. Sub Fires 2 Rockets

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—The Lafayette, first of a new, larger class of Polaris submarines, has fired two of the missiles from beneath the surface of the Atlantic Ocean.

The rockets shot from tubes in the deck of the submerged submarine 26 minutes apart.

They were the first Polaris launchings for the 425-foot-long Lafayette, first of a series of 31 nuclear subs being built to pack longer-range models of the missiles. Ten earlier Polaris subs ranged in length from 330 to 410 feet.

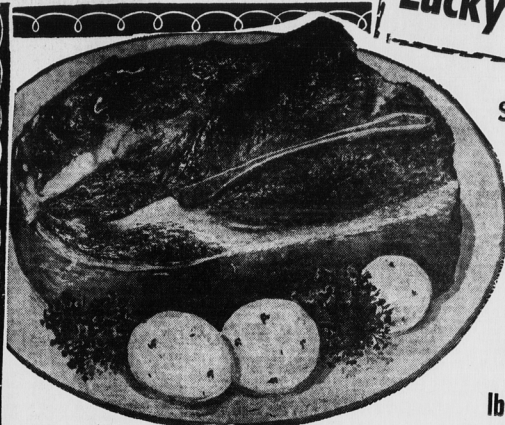

JAMES ERNEST SIMPSON
James Ernest Simpson, a well known school principal, died in Edmonton, Alberta on April 29, 1962, son of James and Edith Mary Wares Simpson was born in Bay View, Prince Edward Island, in 1894. There he spent his boyhood and later attended Prince of Wales College. His teaching career was interrupted when he went overseas to serve with the 2nd Canadian Siege Battery for four years in World War I. Late in 1919 he moved to Western Canada and for 28 years had been on the staff of Edmonton Public School Board. After his retirement from active teaching in 1959, he joined the Faculty of Education at the University of Alberta, as a coordinator of elementary student teaching. Mr. Simpson was active in both provincial and federal politics, and ran as Progressive Conservative candidate for Strathcona East in the provincial election of 1959.

In Edmonton he is survived by his wife Elva, two sons Kenneth and James, one daughter Jean, a stepson Donald and two nieces Miss Vera Simpson and Mrs. Helms Koch. Mrs. W. A. Stewart of Charlottetown, Mrs. M. W. Chespevik of Fredericton, N.B., Mrs. D. J. Gordon of California and W. A. Simpson of Bay View are the surviving sisters and brother.
