SHIPPING AT MONTAGUE The motor vessel "Trinity North" arrived in Montague yesterday morning under the command of Captain John Brenion. The vessel is from Belorun, Nfld., and will take on a load of produce for that port. Also arrived here yesterday was the "Nelle A. Cluett" on her third trip to this port. The Cluett is a Grenfell Mission ship under the command of Captain Kenneth Iverson, and makes about three trips here each year from St. Anthony, Nfld. The vessel will take on a cargo of mixed produce from Poole and Thompson, local exporters.

COUNCIL MEETS RAILWAY OFFICIALS - A special meeting of the Montague Town Council was held yesterday afternoon to meet Mr. F. P. Sigsworth, C.N.R. road master clerk, and Mr. C. W. Milton, C.N.R. divisional engineer. The primary matter under discussion was regarding the sewer running across railway property. At the time the King's County Hospital was built 1947, the main sewer was constructed by the Town from the hospital to the shore, crossing railway property. The then contract called for the payment of \$1.00 for this privilege. Recently the railway advanced the rate to \$5.00 per annum, and by the contract there is no guarantee that the rate will be held at this level. The Council feels that this amount is unjustifiable in view of the fact that the sewer line in no way interferes with railway property, or the operation of trains, and that no amount is due under these particular circumstances.
