Reassessment of Sea Defence Role

Vancouver (CP)—An urgent need for a complete re-assessment and operational re-orientation of Canada's part in maritime defences is suggested by Gen. Charles Foulkes, former chairman of the Canadian chiefs of staff.

He said here in one of a series of articles on defence published by The Sun that an effort should be made to work out "with our NATO partners a comprehensive solution to the threat of the nuclear submarine."

The urgent problem facing the Canadian Navy today is how to cope with the missile-carrying nuclear submarine. "Which can travel anywhere in the way from the Soviet Union to Canadian shores."

Canada's naval force involves a carrier and two squadrons of nuclear-powered frigates, some 40 anti-aircraft frigates and a number of helicopters, and some 40 long-range aircraft.

"The submerged speed of the nuclear submarine is faster than the surface speed of the latest frigates," says Gen. Foulkes.

Three submarines are on lease from the British admiralty, stationed on the East Coast and submarine bases in the West Coast, on loan from the U.S. Navy.

about 450,000 from July to August. He said, however, the city would probably offer conventional debentures from time to time to redeem the bills and help pay for capital expenditures.

He said the bidding on the issue will be on the same basis as for the weekly offering of \$5,000,000 in 91-day bills by the federal government.

Chartered banks and an approved list of investment dealers are invited by the city to bid on the issue. The Bank of Montreal will be agent for the issue.

Two other governments in Canada apart from the federal government issue 91-day treasury bills—the provincial governments of Saskatchewan and Manitoba.

Montreal Plans Financing Move

MONTREAL (CP)—The city of Montreal will call for tender Sept. 13 for its first issue of \$1,000,000 in 91-day treasury bills, Lactance Berger, city finance director, announced.

He said it will be a first time a Canadian city has arranged financing by short-term bills.

The city received authorization from the Quebec Municipal Commission Aug. 30 to raise up to \$30,000,000 by weekly tendering of treasury bills with a maximum of \$2,000,000 a week.

Mr. Berger said the bills will permit the city to borrow for a long-term at short-term rates.
