MONTREAL

MONTREAL (CP) — Prices were mixed to generally higher with mainly fractional changes at the close of the Montreal and Canadian stock exchanges Friday.

Among firmer papers, Eddy A dropped 7 to 63 1/2. Abitibi rose 1 1/2 to 37 1/2, and Howard Smith was up one point to 41. Consolidated Paper rose 1/4 to 41 1/4. Utilities were mixed. Gatineau Power dropped a point to 38 1/2, while Quebec Power rose a point to 40. Other changes were fractional.

Metals were generally higher. Rises of 1/4 were noted in Argus at 38, Asbestos at 26, Canada Iron at 33 1/2 and Canada Bronze at 22 1/2. Steels were steady.

Banks slipped a bit. Royal lost 1/2 at 85.

In foods two new lows were hit by Loblaw's A at 32 1/4 down 1/4, and Loblaw's B at 32 1/4, down 1/4. Labatts hit a new low at 27 1/4, down 1/4. Other beverages rose; Molson's A at 26 1/4 and Molson's B at 26 each rose 1/4.

Penny issues were firm. New Hosco rose 24 cents at 1.00. Abitibi gained 17 cents at 69, and Orchan seven cents at 1.00.

The closing averages show banks off 0.06 at 67.21, utilities off 0.8 at 158.0, industrials up 1.3 at 313.9, combined up 0.5 at 260.2, papers up 7.6 at 455.7 and golds unchanged at 88.35.

NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — The proposed merger of Texaco with Superior Oil of California provided some excitement in a dull and irregular stock market Friday.

The merger, if it goes through, would create a firm with combined operations controlling an estimated 8 per cent of total oil production in the United States. Texaco's proposed takeover of Superior Oil would be on the basis of 24 shares of Texaco for each share of Superior. Texaco rose steadily to a net gain of 4 1/4 to close at 79 1/4.

Superior Oil closed with a gain of 105 points, putting the closing price at 1,825.

Aircrafts ended with moderate gains. Steel wound up the day with a mixed pattern.

Rails, coppers, motors, airlines and chemicals drifted off.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks closed unchanged at \$233.70.

Gainers among Canadian stocks on the New York Exchange, were Aluminium Ltd., up 1/2, McIntyre Porcupine, up 1/2, and Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagrams 1/4. Dome Mines lost 1/4 and International Nickel 1/4.

Among Canadians on the American stock exchange Canadian Marconi gained 1/4. Preston East Dome 1/4 and Sapphire Petroleum 1-16. Brazilian Traction lost 1/4 and Fargo Oil 1-16.


