New York Stocks

NEW YORK, (AP)— News of President Eisenhower's heart attack sent the stock market spinning down Monday in one of the greatest falls it ever has suffered.

Losses ran from one to seven points in many scores of stocks and on out to around 14 points at the worst in key areas.

The frightening shock of the unexpected news raised an obscuring cloud of uncertainties over the political and economic scene.

In Wall Street and around the world that meant only one thing to a majority of stockholders—sell now and analyze the news later.

The great deluge of selling came at a time when the market was acutely vulnerable. It has been booming ahead with unprecedented strength for two years, and last Friday it was at an historic peak.

The Associated Press average of 90 stocks, the yardstick which is greater when measured on a percentage basis.

All segments of the stock market were engulfed by the selling Monday.

The industrial component of the AP average was down 8 1/2%—the biggest since July 21, 1933.

U. S. Steel was the day's most active issue down 5 1/2% at 91 1/2.

Volume was one of the larger totals in the history of the stock market at 7,720,000 shares.

There were 131 lows for the year. One stock hit a high.

WINNIPEG (CP)— Grain prices called following a hesitant trend in initial stages on the Winnipeg grain exchange Monday.

The plunge was set off by news of President Eisenhower's illness and speculation as to what now will shape up on the United States political scene.

International Nickel led the mines down with a 4 1/2 drop to 79 1/2. Gaspe Copper lost 3 1/2. Consolidated Smelting 2, Hudson Bay 1.3-4 and Noranda 1 1/4. Other losses ranged to Norampsk's 80 cents.

McIntyre fell 4 1/4 to head the downward golds. La Luz was one of the advancing issues, adding 4 1/2 to \$3.10. Gunnar warrants were knocked back a sharp \$1.10, leading low uranium.

In a long list of western oil declines, Bailey-Seburn Pacific Petroleum and Royalty all lost dollar or more.

Index losses: golds 3.02 to 84.83, base metals 7.85 to 212.03 and western oils 8.08 to 111.44.

Canadian issues followed the general trend with substantial drops. Distillers Seagram dropped 1/4 to 4 1/4, McIntyre dropped 1/2 to 7 1/4, International Nickel was off 7 1/2 at 80, Hiram Walker was down 3/4 to 75 and Canadian Pacific lost 3/4 at 31 1/2. Dome Mines eased 1/2.

On the American stock exchange Royalty Oil dropped 1 to 14 1/2, Giant Yellowknife was off 1-1/2 and Lake Shore slipped 1/2.

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
