Orange-Nut Cupcakes
Coffee Tea Milk

Orange-Nut Cupcakes: Measure ¼ c. butter or shortening into bowl. Gradually blend in ½ c. sugar, 1 beaten egg, and 1 tbs. grated orange rind.
Sift together 1¼ c. already-sifted enriched flour, ¼ tsp. salt, 1 tsp. baking powder and ¼ tsp. baking soda. Stir in ½ c. chopped pecans, filberts or walnut meats. Add alternately with ½ c. orange juice to first mixture. Mix thoroughly, but do not beat.

Fill oiled 2" muffin pans a little more than half with batter. Bake 20-25 min. in moderate oven, 375 degrees F. Cool 2 min. in pan. Then remove and finish cooling.
Use plain, or dip in orange syrup to glaze them. To glaze, insert a two-tined fork into each cake and dip quickly in and out of orange syrup. Cool on a cake rack.

Orange Syrup: In small saucepan combine ¼ c. orange juice, 1 c. sugar and 1 tbs. fine-grated orange rind. Stir over low heat until sugar dissolves. Increase heat and boil rapidly 5 min. Use as directed.

TRICK OF THE CHEF
