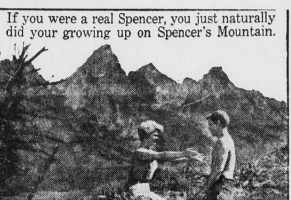

Mr. Pendergast also suggested it would underline the "togetherness" of Confederation if all provinces would agree to take part in a "tillicum polech," an ancient ceremony performed by West Coast Indians that saw various tribes band together for a giant celebration and an exchange of gifts. In his recent reply Mr. Black wrote: "I have your letter in which you outline the idea of a Tillicum Polech. I am very pleased to have the thought of an easterner interested in the centennial."
