ON MARITIME UNION

4 Premiers Stronger In Appeal Than One

Four premiers, each supported by his executive, can make a stronger appeal at Ottawa for Maritime rights than one premier for the four Atlantic provinces, suggests Premier Walter Shaw of Prince Edward Island. He was interviewed on television last night.

Mr. Shaw said, however, he is rearguing full comment on the proposal for Atlantic union, as the question will probably come up in the sitting of the legislature that opened last week.

The premier told interviewer Jack McAndrew on the "Gazette" show that quite apart from the idea of political union of Prince Edward Island, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland there could be much mutual benefit derived from co-operative efforts. "We can all get together and pull together on many projects of advantage to all," said Mr. Shaw. "The thing is to get united action."

Asked if P.E.I. might not just be slow to accepting this idea as it was when it lagged several years behind other seaboard provinces in joining Confederation, Mr. Shaw remarked that residents of most islands seem to have the peculiarity of wanting to deliberate well before making a decision. On the Confederation question the people of P.E.I. had been hesitant about accepting the promises that Islanders would enjoy equal rights and equal opportunities with Canadians everywhere in the country, and Mr. Shaw said he wondered if they had not been right to demur, the way things have turned out.

A principal export of this island is people, said Mr. Shaw.

New Members Welcomed To Legislature

Two Liberals, elected in the Feb. 9 provincial by-elections, were sworn in yesterday and took their seats in the Legislature.

They are William Acorn, representing First Kings, and Alex Campbell, representing Fifth Prince.

Liberals now hold 18 seats in the 30-seat Legislature.

House Speaker Frank Myers welcomed the members to the Legislature.

Declaration Day proceedings showed that Mr. Campbell has a 79-vote majority over Conservative candidate Claude Ives, while Mr. Acorn had a majority of 16 over Conservative candidate Albert Griffin.

UIC Charge Nets \$15 Fine

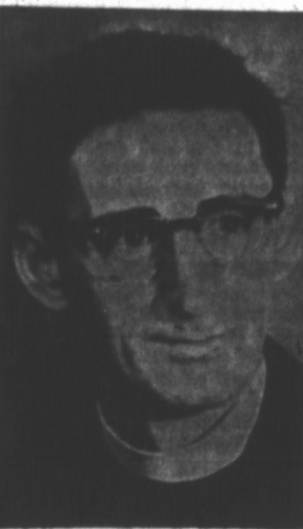
