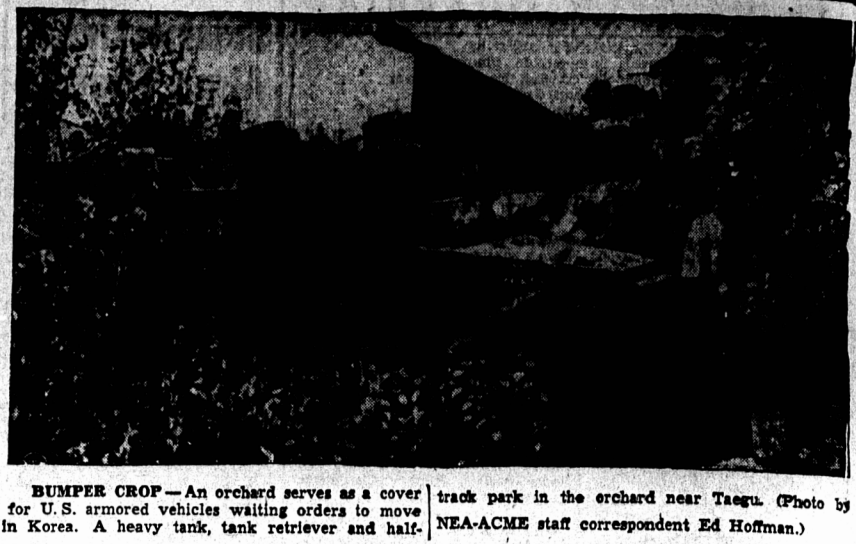
"But you see nothing ever went her way until her mother died," said Shirley. "It may sound brutal, but that's the way it was."

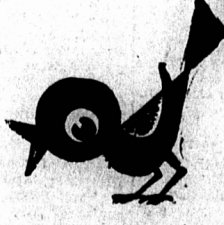
