

The New Tariff on Eggs.

Some one has advised the Canadian egg raisers to get the eggs from their hens when they command high prices in Boston and New York; and then they won't feel that extra five cents a dozen, which the new tariff imposes.

We think we hear them reply, "well that's pretty poor comfort when the hens and pullets, too, instead of laying are simply standing around looking and asking for more corn." Please keep in mind if you feed them much corn you won't get an egg, that is a certain fact.

If we could only get an egg a day, or even every other day at this season, we would soon get rich, says many a party who keeps hens. John T. Porter, of Swathmore, Pa., offers hints to such that might profitably try.
