## Air Commodore To Visit Summerside RCAF Air Base

Air Commodore William I. Clements, OBE, CD, Air Officer Commanding, Maritime Air Command will arrive at RCAF Station Summerside on Tuesday, for a three day visit. This will be Air Commodore Clements' first official inspection of the Island station since he took over the post as head of Maritime Air Command in July.

Air Commodore W.I. Clements was born at North Devon, N.B., in August, 1909, and after graduating from Devon Public School and the Fredericton High School, he entered the Royal Military College at Kingston, Ont.

On January 1, 1933, A-C Clements was appointed to a commission in the RCAF, and the following year, after having completed Army Co-operation, Instrument Flying and Seaplane Conversion training courses, was transferred to flying duties with No. 5 Coastal Reconnaissance Squadron. While serving with the squadron he filled positions as pilot, adjutant and liaison officer and during the summer of 1934 and 35, while serving as officer-in-charge of the Shediac Detachment, he flew on anti-submarine operations in co-operation with the RCMP.

Reposted to Canada in November, 1940, he served on staff duties at Air Force Headquarters, Ottawa, until November, 1943, when promoted to the rank of group captain and named RCAF representative on a British Military Mission which was engaged in duties in the Pacific and Far East theatres of operation.

In August, 1954, A-C Clements was transferred to the RCAF's No. 1 Air Division Headquarters, Metz, France, as chief of staff, and three years later was returned to AFHQ to serve as chief of personnel.

A-C Clements was awarded the Croix de Guerre with gold star by the French government, and was appointed an Officer of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire in January, 1946.

## Three Men Committed For Trial In Supreme Court

SUMMERSIDE — Gerald Vincent Gracie and James Alexander Jackman, both of Glace Bay, and Alfred James Kelly of Borden were committed for trial in Supreme Court at their preliminary hearing by Magistrate R.S. Hinton, Q.C., here yesterday.

The trio is charged with robbery with violence of a Water Street snack bar owner Theodore Perry on the night of September 27th.

All three of the accused elected trial by judge and jury. The trial will be held at the next sitting of the Supreme Court.

Magistrate Hinton assured Alfred Kelly's defence counsel, George MacMahon, Q.C., that legal procedures were available for a mental examination of his client, but denied an adjournment of the hearing for this purpose.

"I don't see why we should take it for granted that people who commit crime are in need of mental examination," said Magistrate Hinton.

He pointed out that the heavy work schedule of the lower courts would be continually disrupted if the procedure was resorted to frequently.

Magistrate Hinton said he could see no point of bringing doctors into routine preliminary hearings unless the evidence was more pronounced in the matter than was indicated by the accused in this case.

The case was adjourned until next Tuesday when the commitment for trial will be signed.

Two 16-year-old youths pleaded guilty to theft of money from milk bottles. One was given a six-month suspended sentence. The other, who had appeared earlier in the morning was committed for a period of not more than two years in the boys industrial home in St. John, in view of his previous record.
