Actually he said the amount he was receiving was not a salary, but rather he was being paid for the use of an office with which the Centennial Committee had not been provided. He said that payments were being made to him at the rate of \$100 per month with the exception of June, July and August when this amount was doubled to \$200.

Coun. MacDonald said that a great many citizens felt that the Centennial entertainment arrangement was not for the citizen himself. He felt that a larger amount of free entertainment should be provided. In this matter Coun. Gormley concurred. The mayor told the Council that for the balance of the summer a regular band concert would be held each Wednesday evening in one of the City's Squares or in the Park. In addition to these, he said that arrangements were made to have several military organizations give concerts.

BUILDING PERMIT
An application from the McColl Frontenac Oil Company to erect a service station with an accompanying parking lot with a 100 car capacity was approved. It was pointed out by the applicant that the new station would be replacing the one demolished at Queen and Sydney Streets with the erection of the Federal Building. The new station will be located at 220-222 Queen Street.

The matter of parking on Grafton Street was brought before the Council. It was pointed out that the large number of cars being parked in the vicinity of Zion Church were becoming a hazard to cars stopping at the lighted intersection.

Mayor Stewart pointed out that the large parking space in connection with the Imperial Oil Service Station was not being used by citizens. He said that parking space in this area was free, and no motorist should feel obliged to make a purchase as a result of having parked there.

New Zealand Official Is Guest Speaker At Rotary

"As sister nations in the Commonwealth we stood together in times of stress for the defence of those ideals we hold in common. We may face the future not only in hope, but with a sure confidence," Mr. T. C. A. Hislop, High Commissioner from New Zealand to Canada said in an address before the Rotary Club luncheon meeting at the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday.

Mr. Hislop vividly described his homeland as consisting of two small islands 1250 miles north of Australia with a population of two million people who live happily "except for a Divine discontent which makes for progress". 95 per cent of the population are of Scottish, Irish, English and Welsh descent who reflect a general outlook and ideals which come from long association and background of British institutions, very much as exists in Canada.

"The early settlers, however, beat the Scottish by more than 700 years in reaching the country. These were the Maori, who are a splendid race of people who enjoy full equality as fellow-citizens distinguished by their scholarly attainments as part of the national life," Mr. Hislop said.

"Farming is the basis of national economy. Providence having given us a bounteous land, equitable climate both productive and beautiful. One may see any type of scenery seen anywhere in the world in one or two days (travel in New Zealand)," he said.

"Semi-tropical to hills and fjords of scenic perfection may be viewed with delight, but unfortunately we do not have thousands of visitors tripping across the border, as in Canada, to enjoy what we have to offer.

"Thirty-nine million sheep, pasture cattle and dairy cows enable us to raise a great export dairy products traffic second largest in the world. We ship as much wool as is put on the English market by Australia and the Argentine combined," Mr. Hislop said.

He touched on the newly developed pulpwood and paper industry which gives promise of providing all of these products to fill the needs of the country. The form of government was described as a wide general application of the terms of democracy. The standard of living is considered average, with no poverty and absolutely no such thing as unemployment. The recorded number seeking work last year was 27. "We could do much more

with an increase in population to develop the country," Mr. Hislop said.

HERE SINCE 1950
Mr. Hislop, who came to Canada in 1950 has since traveled 200,000 miles to become acquainted with people and industries, was introduced by the chairman, Dr. Frank MacKinnon.

Discover Major Zinc, Lead And Copper Deposits
DILLWYN, Va. (AP)—The discovery of major deposits of zinc, lead and copper ore along a three-mile front in Virginia's oldtime "Gold Belt" in Buckingham county was announced today by a Canadian mining concern.

Virginia Minerals Corporation, with headquarters in Montreal, said 2½ years of exploratory core-drilling indicated a minimum of 406,873 tons of ore in the old London and Virginia mine site a mile north of here.

George Dufresne, president of the company, said there is a possibility that the site may contain another 600,000 tons of zinc, lead and copper sulphide ores.

Assays have shown an average value of \$18.50 per ton for the ores, an average mineable grade, said John D. Hagan, resident mining engineer for the company.

And a spokesman for the company told the Richmond Times-Dispatch that an aerial survey of a much larger, 10-by-10 mile area indicates "several other similar zones" of ore riches perhaps greater than the original find.

A spokesman for the company said as a result of the aerial survey, Virginia Mining Corporation has more than doubled its previous options.
