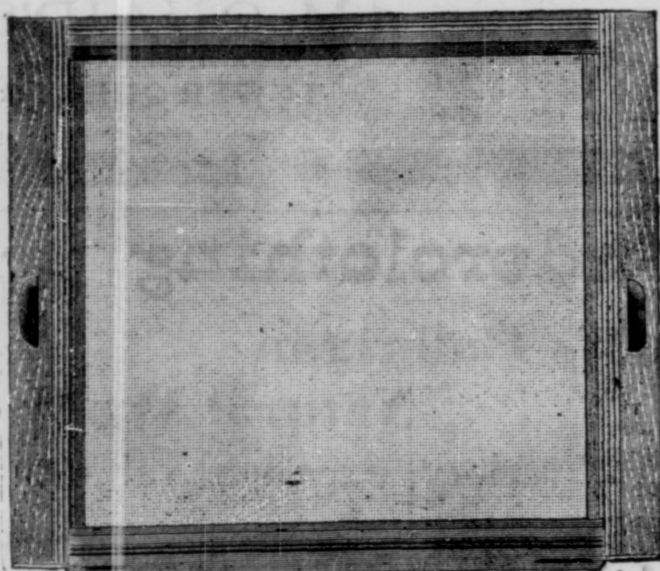

THE ELECTIONS IN BRITISH COLUMBIA

Martin has 23 Opponents Only Ten Supporters

SATISFACTION THROUGHOUT CANADA.

New Legislature Overwhelmingly Conservative.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

VANCOUVER, B. C., June 11.—Some time ago Lieutenant Governor McInnis dismissed his advisers and called in Joseph Martin to form a cabinet.

A few weeks ago His Honor's son, who had a seat in the House of Commons at Ottawa, resigned for the purpose of entering British Columbia politics as a follower of Martin, who, after forming a make-shift administration appealed to the country. He now finds himself with only 10 supporters opposed by 23.

The Governor, who was appointed by the Laurier-Tarte administration, will doubtless be asked to resign.

Martin, himself, is elected at the head of the poll in Vancouver City.

Two other cabinet ministers, Hon. J. C. Brown, in New Westminster, and Hon. Smith Curtis in West Kootenay, Rossland district, have also been returned.

Curtis defeated the Hon. C. H. MacIntosh in the latter district by a majority of thirty.

Hon. G. W. Beebe, Cabinet Minister, is defeated in West Yale by Murphy the Opposition candidate.

Satisfaction at Ottawa.

OTTAWA, June 11.—Much interest has been felt here in the British Columbia election.

FROM THE THEATRE OF WAR

Buller Reports a smart Engagement.

THE BRITISH HAVE SIX KILLED AND SEVEN WOUNDED.

Railway Destroyed—Report Regarding Prisoners at Pretoria.

GENERAL BULLER'S REPORT.

LONDON, June 11.—The War Office has received the following despatch from General Buller:

"Headquarters in Natal, June 10.—With reference to my telegram of the 8th, we halted yesterday to get our trains up the pass, which is very steep.

"I find that the enemy were about 2000 strong in very carefully prepared positions which they must have been disheartened not to have held longer than they did.

"They have all retired about 26 miles to the northwest.

"I find our casualties were more than I first thought. They were one officer wounded and two men killed and thirteen men wounded."

RAILWAY DESTROYED.

LONDON, June 11.—Gen. Forester-Walker wires the War Office from Cape Town: "Information received from natives early on Saturday reports the enemy in three columns near Honing.

"The railway has been almost completely destroyed between America and Roodersval."

A SMART ENGAGEMENT.

LONDON, June 11.—General Buller reports: Natal Headquarters, June 11.—The force concentrated on Klip River at its junction with the Gansville. Last night we anticipated at that defile a force of the enemy, about three thousand strong, who had, I think, intended to occupy it and who retired as soon as our heavy guns opened.

The South African Light Horse and Second Cavalry Brigade were smartly engaged while covering our left front.

Our casualties are about six killed and seven wounded.

ONE OF THE REPORTS.

LONDON, June 11.—It is reported here this morning that Lord Roberts has imprisoned in the race course all the male residents of Pretoria.

REGIMENT CUT TO PIECES.

HALIFAX, June 11.—Sir Foresier Walker, in command of the British guarding lines of communication, reports that the Fourth Battalion of the Derbyshire Regiment was cut to pieces on Thursday.

The losses include all but six men of the Battalion.

HOT IN ST. LOUIS.

Four Persons Killed and Many Wounded in Riot Yesterday.

St. Louis, June 11.—They were numerous encounters between the strikers and their sympathizers, and the constituted authorities here yesterday, resulting in four deaths and a number wounded.

SOLDIERS MOVING TO PUT DOWN BOXERS

Queen Dowager in Danger.

SHE HAS FLED TO RUSSIAN LEGATION.

Wildest Reports in Circulation.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

HONG KONG, June 11.—Two hundred and fifty men of the Welsh Fusiliers, and also sappers and miners, have been ordered to hold themselves in readiness to proceed north on account of "Boxer" disturbances.

Their places will be filled by troops from India.

TIENTSIN, June 11.—About 1500 foreign troops of all arms left for Peking by two troop trains this morning.

LONDON, June 11.—Ten thousand troops of all nationalities, according to a despatch to the Daily Express from Shanghai, will be sent to Peking to back up the demands of the ministers upon the government or, if necessary, to suppress the "Boxers" themselves.

The Daily Mail has the following from Tien Tsin, dated Friday: The wildest rumors are current here to the effect that Peking is burned, but they lack confirmation.

LONDON, June 11.—A despatch from Tien Tsin says: "It is reported here that the Dowager Empress has fled to the Russian legation at Peking for protection."
