

PEI Newman Conference Reps to Visit Nursing Homes

The purpose of the Conference was to meet with representatives from ten other Maritime Universities to create ways and means of encouraging people to develop a social conscience. Each university presented a project which they would carry out after their re-

turn to their respective campuses.

The main point of the conference was that it is the responsibility of each individual to wake up to the needs of those around him or her and to do something to improve the situation wherever improvement is called for. Improve what?, you may ask. Well, for starters, how about the atmosphere right on campus? If you are dissatisfied with the apathetic attitude of the student body, then do something
