

Sentences Deferred In Three Youths Cases

AMOS Ramsay of Alberton appeared before Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald yesterday after serving the past week in custody and had sentence deferred until October 15 on a charge of breaking and entering a home in Alberton, May 1.

Accused was warned by Magistrate MacDonald to keep away from liquor and behave himself as earlier evidence revealed he was highly intoxicated when the crime was committed. Nothing was taken but a little meat from the refrigerator.

Two youths from Albany Clifford B. Walsh and Sampson Howard MacKay, had their sentences deferred until October 15 on condition they enter into a recognizance in the amount of \$100 each, comprised of 100 sureties of \$500 each.

They pleaded guilty to breaking and entering the dwelling of house of Wilbur Cameron, Albany. Other conditions imposed by the magistrate included that they report to Cpl. W.J.R. MacDonald, before charge of the Borden detachment R.C.M.P. twice a month; that restitution be made to Mr. Cameron; and refrain from any alcoholic beverages; keep the peace and be of good behaviour; be at home no later than midnight and remain in the province during the deferral period.

Magistrate MacDonald told the young men that their future depended on their actions during this period and no amount of intervention would prevent him from detaching them to Dorchester Penitentiary if they should break any of the conditions imposed.

Bible Society raised Near \$13,000 in ear

The 128th annual meeting of the Prince Edward Island Society of the United Bible Societies was held in St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Montague, Monday evening, May 13.

Wholesale district secretary for New Brunswick and P.E.I., J. B. Whelan, presented his report of the society and at the same time commended the island district for continuing loyalty and support.

"The fact of a population explosion is generally known," he said, "but its significance for the future of mankind has not been fully grasped by even the most discerning. But it is a fact that every 30 seconds a new human being is born into the world and 40 die, making a net increase of 40 persons every 30 minutes. This gives us as Christians the responsibility of 40 more human beings yearly to feed and to win for Jesus Christ."

"There are about 50,000,000 people in the world today, and at least 17,000,000 of them are absolutely and completely ignorant of the Bible."

"There is a tremendous thirst for learning among the peoples of the less developed areas of the world. This is perhaps one of the most significant factors in our time. Everywhere the level of literacy is rising and it is possible that in the foreseeable future the amazing achievement may be realized that there will be basic education for everyone. It is our learning to read, and to write, but the best estimate is that every year nearly a million new people are learning to read."

"This development presents a great challenge to the Bible societies," he continued, "as Communism and other ideologies and religions are taking full advantage by supplying their literature in abundance and almost without cost."

Education Crisis Said Due To Failure To Anticipate

"The crisis now facing Canadian education is the result of our past thinking that today would be like yesterday, and of our present thinking that tomorrow will be like today," stated C. E. Edwards, in an address to the Prince Edward Island Federation of Home and School Associations at a special meeting in Montgomery Hall last evening.

"The rapid increase in the number of regional high schools and what we have in fact created at the close of the First Great War," Mr. Edwards continued, "is not being met by the same pace with the great advancement of science we must spend more and more on education. We are always richer after every education bill we pass, but not as rich as we had paid more."

Parents and teachers must do everything possible to advance education he said, "home and school, therefore, needs to study, to evaluate what we have now, to determine our needs, and to promote."

"Changes in education, involving money, do not just happen. Provincial departments of education need to be backed by an informed public opinion."

Mr. Edwards said that no other organization was better equipped to do the job than the Canadian H. and S. plus the P. T. Federation, with its membership of over 300,000.

EDUCATIONAL TV

The topic "The Significance of Educational Television" was dealt with at length by Mr. Edwards. "Introduce educational TV and watch your ideas of what education really is change," he suggested. Educational TV challenges students to assume a greater degree of responsibility for their own learning, initiative and creativeness.

He had attended the UNESCO Conference, Oslo, Norway, this year as an observer. His ideas on TV education stating that Europe and Scandinavia were far ahead of Canada in this field.

UNESCO research has led Mr. Edwards to believe that "TV is all the time influencing the beliefs and moral attitudes of our children." "Every program helps create a picture in the child's mind of the contemporary world — it may be distorted or incomplete picture."
