## "Pressure Centres" In The Brain Are Near Pain Centres

(Editor's note: Electric explorations of the brains of animals and a few humans have shown that the shocking of different areas produces different reactions—ranging from fear to warm pleasure. How this research is helping the study of mental illness is told in this fourth of five articles on the human mind.)

NEW YORK (AP)—Deep within your brain may lie groups of brain cells that could give magnificent feelings of bliss and pleasure.

Just such amazing "pleasure centres" have been found in rats' brains.

Activate a pleasure centre with a tiny electric shock, and even a very hungry rat likes the result better than eating. The feelings can gratify the drives for hunger, thirst and sex.

These are some results from new research using tiny electrical probes to explore secrets of the brain. The findings may become valuable in treating mental diseases.

Ultra-thin needles or electrodes are thrust deep into the brain, without causing any pain or damage. The needles are left in place for days or months. Tiny electric shocks can be set off at points along the needles, to stir specific areas of the brain into action. (It is entirely different from giving potent electric shock treatments for some mental diseases.)

This technique is helping scientists to explore the mysteries of the primitive brain, the deeper core of the brain which was well developed in animals 100 million years ago. It controls automatic affairs, like heart beat and breathing, and acts to rouse and satisfy basic needs such as hunger and sleep.

Over it lies the new brain or cortex, extremely high developed in humans, which is our thinking machine. The cortex has been fairly well mapped. It's known which areas record taste, smell, sound, and control movements of arms and legs according to our mental orders.

## British Students Will Visit Canada

CAMBRIDGE, England (CP)—A group of 172 students at Cambridge University will fly to Canada at the end of June to spend their summer vacations working in Canada.

The transatlantic jaunt is being organized by the university's Canada Club, which has chartered three aircraft for the trip. A similar scheme was announced recently by students at Oxford University.

## Says Japanese Shipbuilders Face Depression

TOKYO (Reuters)—Japanese shipbuilders have been selling themselves short and face the threat of a depression within three years, a major shipbuilding company said in a report Monday.

Helped by low costs and quick deliveries, Japan has replaced Britain as the world's largest shipbuilding nation, but the Mitsui shipbuilding company warned in its report that many Japanese companies have sold themselves short to get orders, taking on the risk of rising costs in materials and labor.

Most vessels launched in Japan last year were built under contracts negotiated in 1954-55, when the industry was suffering from lack of orders.

The net result has been that shipbuilders, if not actually losing money, are barely managing to break even, the report said.

## Premium Ores Case Raises Question Of Double Taxation

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister St. Laurent said Tuesday that United States attempts to collect back taxes from Canadian Premium Ores Ltd. are based on the assertion that the company has a permanent establishment in the U.S.

He gave Commons reply to Social Credit leader Solon Lougheed's question on the increase in protest against American attempts to impose income taxes on a "purely Canadian company."

"Of course we have to realize," said Mr. St. Laurent, "that it is not as a Canadian company that these proceedings have been instituted against that assumed taxpayer but the attempt to assess and collect taxes from that taxpayer is because of the assertion that it has a permanent establishment in the U.S."

Premium Ores is a Canadian company reported to be controlled by Canadian-born industrialist Cyrus Eaton and his associate, William R. Daley, both of Cleveland.

The U.S. tax case against them, involving about \$2,000,000, now is before the American courts. It has aroused considerable interest in business circles because of its possible impact on the Canadian-U.S. tax treaty.

The treaty is designed to eliminate payment of double taxes by individuals and companies operating on both sides of the border. Most are subsidiaries of American firms operating in Canada.

Under the treaty the question of whether a corporation of one country is subject to tax in the other depends on whether that corporation has a "permanent establishment" in the other country.

It is seeking \$1,600,000 from Mr. Eaton and \$400,000 from Mr. Daley in back taxes. The two men have denied receiving such a fee. The American government has argued alternatively that if the two men are not liable to the tax, then Premium Iron is because it has a permanent establishment in the U.S. The defendants have denied that, also.

The American court case started last spring. A decision is expected this year.

## Has "Chance Of Lifetime" - Says

LONDON (CP)—After 37 years with a British banking company, James Masters is going to Canada to take a job he regards as the "chance of a lifetime."

At 55, Masters is leaving the old British firm of Baring Brothers to take up an appointment as assistant vice-president of finance for Canadian Pacific Railway in Montreal.

Until recently, he acted as personal assistant to Sir Edward Peacock, the Canadian born octogenarian who is a CPR director. Sir Edward has resigned from Baring Brothers.

Masters and his wife, with their 23-year-old daughter Hilary, sail for Canada March 26. A son, Julian, training as a stockbroker, remains in London.
