**WE THE GUILD OF THAMICS**

and Alamo Riley Jr. In remembrance of the late William F. Dingwell, who died on October 6th, 1964. The Guild of Thamics, 100 St. John's Street, Charlottetown, P.E.I.

As we discussed Argentina's mixed political and economic views, he suddenly launched an unexpected attack against his nation and fellow-countrymen. "There is a war," said the banker, "that when God made the world. He made Argentina last."

After God had almost finished shaping earth, his bag still contained beautiful mountains, fish-filled rivers, fertile fields, rich pastures and forests, oil fields and a temperate climate.

"God filled them all at the bottom of South America. It seemed unright, however, that any one country should have such an abundance of natural wealth and assets. So, to even things up, I populated the country with Argentinians."

My banker friend told me this rich land of wheat and corn has been steadily deteriorating. "Zoning inflation has carried the cost of living upward by more than 25 per cent this year. Runaway government spending and featherbedding are expected to leave the treasury with the highest debt in Argentina's history, about \$600,000,000 by the end of 1964.

The deep, rich grass of the pampas, and the great, fat grazers there, should assure Argentina that, whatever happens, he will always eat steak. But, this year, even steak is rationed.

With herds decimated by years of drought, the beef industry is in bad shape. Although there are some 40,000 cattle on the pampas, it is not enough to meet both domestic and foreign demand, and cattlemen are holding back stock as they struggle to rebuild.

As a result, Monday and Tuesday have been decreed by law "meatless days."

On either of these days, it is not possible to find a single meat dish on the menu of any Buenos Aires restaurant, and any eating establishment violating the law faces a stiff fine.

Now, the Argentinians are faced with the ignominy of importing beef from neighboring Uruguay and Paraguay for the first time in history.

That is not all. Argentina is finding it cheaper to import eggs from Ireland, potatoes from Peru and rice from Japan than to produce them at home.
