In a parting message to Canada, B. A. Butler, seen above, Britain's ambassador to the exchequer, appealed to Dominion and the U. S. to boost purchases of British goods and thus help eliminate Britain's currency and trade restrictions. "The dollar world, especially the U. S., must make it easier for us to trade on competitive terms. Trade and not aid is the key to the trade," said Mr. Butler before he returned to London following a three-day visit to Ottawa and before that to Washington. During his talks with Trade Minister Howe he had discussed the best way Britain could compete in the Canadian market.

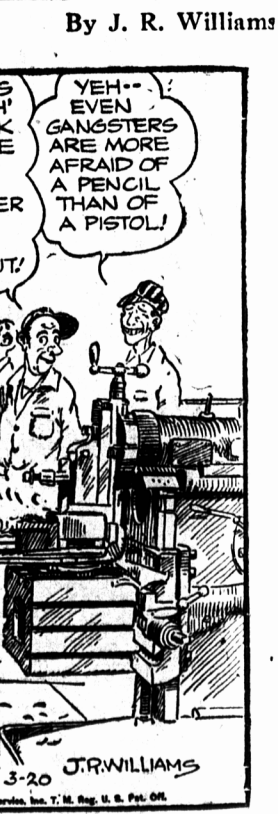
