Shots span many years of history

The first half of the past 100 years is spanned in the pictures above as they trace Island life from 1865 to the early years of the present century.

How much importance was attached to military training in the middle 1800's is once again shown by the long ago group of cavalrymen on parade about the year 1865. The Queens County Cavalry, top left, was commanded then by Hon. Benjamin Davies as they lined up on Kent Street.

So little change is evident in the middle photo that only the woman's dress and the horses and carriages betray the fact the picture was taken in the 1890's and not in more recent times.

It shows the corner of Kent and Queen Streets. There are many Islanders still living who will readily recognize or recall the men shown in the photo on the right. They were members of the City School Board shortly after the turn of the century. Included in the group, and readily recognized, were the trio in the centre of the beloved Dr. S. B. Jenkins and Frederick Nash, sometime editor of The Patriot. In the back row, in front between them is the late J. J. Johnston who became one of the truly great courtroom figures in Island history.

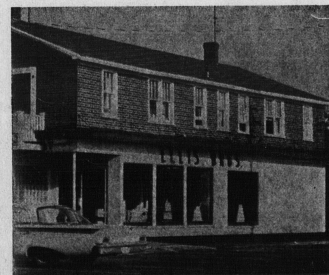

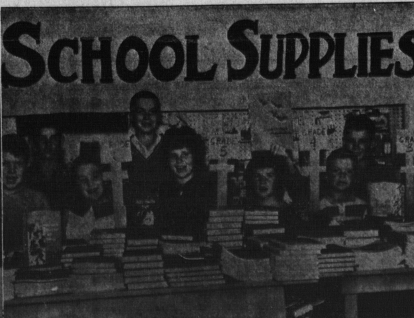


Ellis Bros. Store in the Year 1946
