Praise Handed To Canada For Helping Needy Areas

By DOUG MARSHALL LONDON (CP) — H.O. Moran, director-general of the Canadian external aid office, said here today was a visit to a year for Canadian aid and Canada won praise in Paris this week for its efforts to help needy countries last year. The praise came at the annual meeting of the development and assistance committee of the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development. Moran was interviewed here, where he has talks scheduled with British officials before he flies back to Ottawa Saturday.

OECD members, he said, particularly approved the quality of the aid and the terms in which it was given, although they would like to see Canadian contributions increase still more in volume.

Last year 50 per cent of the aid was in the form of direct grants, 12 per cent in the form of soft loans and the rest in loans at the commercial rate of six-per-cent interest.

He said other donor countries were interested in many aspects of the Canadian program. Canada, with 14 years' experience, had managed to avoid many of the pitfalls other countries encountered.

WORKS ON PRIORITY The reason for this, Moran said, is Canada concentrates on high-priority items that will promote the educational and economic development of the country, in accordance with priorities the receiving countries themselves have established.

Canada also recognized that many developing countries didn't need additional projects but wanted help in maintaining projects they already had. Canada had met this with gifts of commodities such as copper, aluminum, fertilizers and similar goods.

Moran told the OECD committee Canada's aid commitments in goods and services totalled \$185,000,000 in 1964. This was 50 per cent higher than in the previous year and double the 1962 figure.

Willard Thorp, an American economist who is chairman of the committee, congratulated Canada on the progress of its aid program and the direction in which it is moving. He said the committee was impressed by Canada's recognition of the vital need for generous terms in aid loans.

"It is a program that is not growing in any one specialized

direction but is being developed broadly in capital projects, educational and technical assistance and in the supply of commodities," Thorp said.

MORE OVERSEAS On the educational and technical side, Canada's training programs for foreign students in Canada now are four times what they were in 1961 and the number of Canadian advisers overseas, 345 last year, is seven

times what it was four years ago, Moran said. Among new developments in the Canadian program were establishment of a separate food aid program for Asian countries, introduction of a development loan fund last year and the decision to extend bilateral Canadian aid to Latin American countries.

One Canadian proposal that was receiving wide support was establishment of a co-ordinated information centre that could keep track of the collective achievement of the Western aid effort.

Crisis In Fishing Industry Is Described-As Serious

HALIFAX (CP) — I. L. Roy Matthews, an official of the British fishing industry, said the crisis facing the world's deep-sea fishing industry is more serious than most people believe. He said stocks are becoming depleted and stricter conservation measures are "an imperative necessity."

Mr. Matthews, chairman of the British White Fish Authority, is in Nova Scotia for discussion with industrial leaders and to observe production and marketing methods. He said in an interview here he feels the European side of the Atlantic has been first to feel the effects of reduced fish stocks.

Mr. Matthews said greater international co-operation will be needed to safeguard future supplies. He said he is encouraged by the degree of understanding

the Russians have been showing recently in this regard. In addition to going farther afield for fish, the fishing nations will have to educate their people to accept other varieties of fish, he said. The British White Fish Authority is an independent government agency, set up to co-ordinate catching, processing and marketing of fish in Britain, and to provide boats and plant financing as well as to undertake research.
