POOR MODERN TOOTH. HOW WE ABUSE OUR VERY SERVICE-ABLE MOLARS

One Authority Says Vegetable Eatere Have Worse Teeth Than Meat Eatere. The Teeth of Egyptians, Anglo-Saxons and Others Compared.

Among thirty-six skulls of ancient Egyptians he found caries in fifteen (41.66 per cent.); in seventy-six Anglo-Saxon skulls he found twelve cases (15.7 per cent.); while among 43 miscellaneous skulls of ancient Britons 24.4 per cent. showed carious teeth.

As to the relative frequency with which different teeth are affected, I think statistics plainly show that it is the first molar tooth of the lower jaw which is most prone to decay of any tooth in the series.

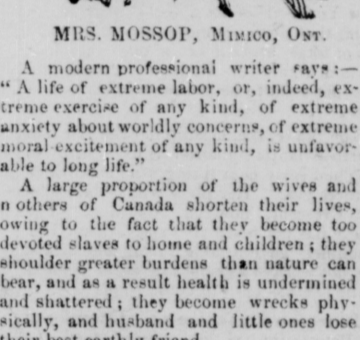

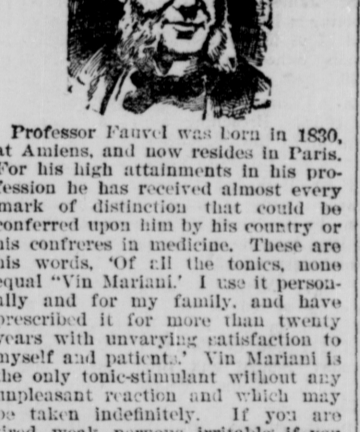

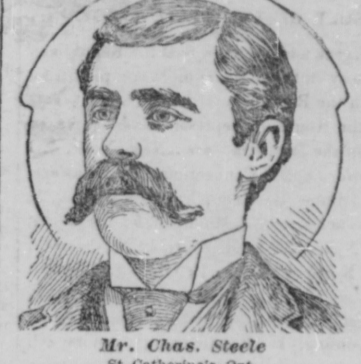
