## Easy To Make Tree Ornaments

No matter how many Christmas tree ornaments you have, it's fun to make new ones. These are easy to make and materials for them are easy to find. An afternoon session with the children helping turns out more than enough for your tree, with plenty to spare for the tree at school or the one you plan for the club.

You will need: Pipe cleaners. Chocolate drops wrapped in silver foil. The narrowest red decorative stick-on tape — 1-4 inch. Paper, metallic, and red and white striped. Water colors. Pliable wire.

To make the chain, dip pipe cleaners in water first, then paint with bright water colors, red yellow, and blue. The pipe cleaners keep their chenille-like fluffiness better when the water color is brushed on than when they are soaked in paint or dye. When the paint is dry, twist each pipe cleaner into a circle, linking circles as you go.

Bells for the bell ornaments are silver foil wrapped chocolate drops. Because the chocolate drops look so much like bells they'll inspire you to try ideas of your own. The string of bells is made with the narrow red stick-on tape. Lay a length of the tape, adhesive side up, flat on a table. Notice that each candy has a very thin tissue paper strip on the top. Stick these paper strips on to the tape so the bells space about 4 inches apart. Now double the tape back on to itself so the colored sides are out and sticky sides are together.

The other bell ornaments are made with pipe cleaners. Make a hole in each chocolate drop to about half its depth with an ice pick or nut pick. For the curlicue ornament, wrap a pipe cleaner the bell cluster use three pipe around a pencil and insert one end into the chocolate drop. For cleaners and three chocolate drops. Bend each pipe cleaner in the middle. Shape one half of each pipe cleaner into a loop, twist the three together and insert the straight ends of the pipe cleaners into the chocolate drops.

You might use the whirligigs with other trimmings or you might like the idea of a whirligig tree. These little flyaway ornaments in red and white striped paper would make a very gay and different tree. Of course you remember how to make them — squares, cut diagonally from the corners almost to the centre. Face the striped paper with another square of the same because both sides show. Gold, silver or colored metallic paper should also be doublefaced. Use pliable wire to fasten the points together. Twist the wire at the front and back of the whirligig to hold it loosely, then use the same wire to fasten the ornament to the tree. Use wire that is long

enough to lift or suspend the whirligig away from the branch so it may whirl.  
Use the decorative tape to fasten the pleated ornament together and to make a loop for it to hang by. Use metallic paper, or ends of bright patterned wrapping paper for these, also double faced.

## CHRISTMAS TREES

### IMPOSSIBLE — UNLESS YOU KNOW HOW

Neat tricks with quite simple apparatus are always a source of fun and laughter at parties, and they command attention and admiration at most other times.

Here is an effective item which calls for nothing more exacting than a half-crown or a penny, an ordinary drinking-glass (with a flat top edge as is possible), and a strip of newspaper eighteen inches long and slightly less than

two inches wide.

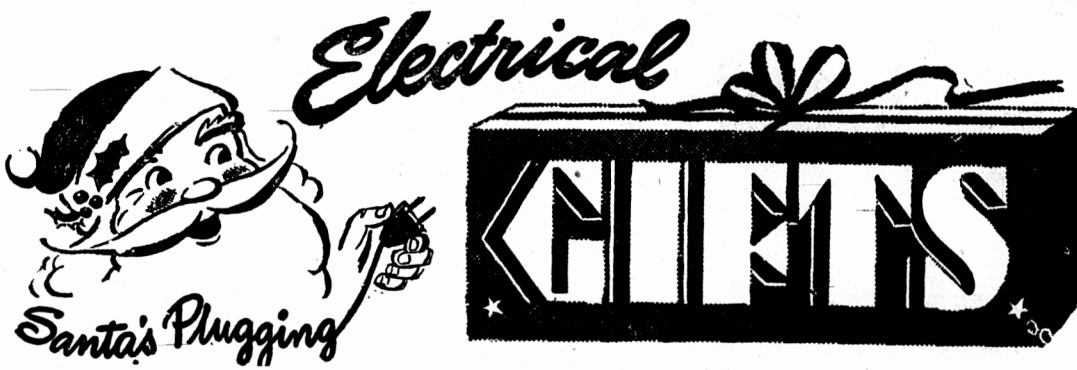
Fill the glass nearly full of water, and lay one end of the strip on the rim of the glass. Place the coin on the strip, taking care to ensure good balance.

Then challenge your audience to remove the paper strip without touching the coin or causing it to fall. Someone hardy enough to hazard forlorn attempts may accept the challenge, but unless a practicable method is known, success is very unlikely.

The correct procedure is to hold

the free end of the strip in one hand, allowing the paper to hang slack, and then to strike the middle of the strip a smart blow with the edge of the other hand. Suddenness and force are desirable, since hesitation and feebleness are almost sure to dislodge the coin from its precarious position.

As in all such tricks, preliminary practice brings the skill and confidence which are necessary for real success.
