Chicago, Toronto Win Crucial Games Saturday

CHICAGO (CP) — Bill Mosenko's third-period goal gave Chicago Black Hawks a 4-3 victory over Detroit Red Wings Saturday night and left the Hawks in a strong position in the fight for the fourth and last National Hockey League playoff berth.

The victory, before 18,944 fans, maintained Chicago's two-point margin over Toronto Maple Leafs for fourth place and left the issue to be decided in Sunday night's games, the last of the season.

Protection For Players In Quebec League Continues

MONTREAL, (CP) — The National Hockey League governors Thursday continued interim recognition and protection of the Quebec Senior Hockey League in its relation to the NHL under what is known as the major series agreement.

This deals with player lists and other rights. The QSHL resigned from the Quebec Amateur Hockey Association in the midst of a dispute between the Q.A.H.A. and the Canadian Amateur Hockey Association.

The N.H.L. governors reported they are still considering the C.A.H.A.'s declaration of suspension of the Q.S.H.L. The governors at the same time unanimously agreed that in the interval the Q.S.H.L. will be given full protection of player lists and other rights.

They also agreed to extend full protection to all sponsorship lists of teams under Q.A.H.A. jurisdiction during the period of the Q.A.H.A.-C.A.H.A. controversy and to recommend to the American Hockey League and the Western Hockey League that they take similar action.

Clubs in the N.H.L. and other professional leagues sponsor teams in the various classifications of the C.A.H.A. Through the sponsorship agreement the sponsoring club has first call on players.

Robinson In Comment On Shift To Third

MIAMI, Fla., (AP) — Jackie Robinson spoke out Sunday about his shift from second to third base, denying reports of racial tension and dissension on Brooklyn Dodgers.

"What's good for the Dodgers is good for Robinson," he said. "If the kid Junior Gilliam can hit .275, I think our club will be stronger with him on second base.

As for racial trouble on the Dodgers, Robinson had this to say: "If we have racial trouble on our ball club, then the rest of the country should have the same thing. It just isn't so. Not with the kind of fellows we have on this team."

Robinson admits he wasn't too happy about shifting off second base to let Gilliam, a Negro rookie up from Montreal, take over his job. He knew it meant a move to third base for himself.
